This summer

was a difficult

one, as we said

goodbye to my

mom, Pauline,



who was 84 years old.

She had suf-

fered from the affects of Alzheimer's disease for at least 15 years with the last five and a half of that spent in a special Alzheimer's care facility in Butte, MT.

This dreaded disease robbed her and our family of many wonderful years of life. Incredibly talented in a number of ways, the field of music was where she excelled, before the onset of her disease. Even after going to the Marquis Home in Butte, when we played classical music or sang hymns at their small church service, her hand would come up as if to conduct the orchestra and her foot would tap in time. Amazingly, she continued to do this until shortly before her death.

Some of her greatest musical accomplishments were conducting the church choir, performing in the Chug Chug Girls musical group, conducting the Ruby Valley Chorale, organizing the Jubilate musical retreat with several friends and participating in the Butte Symphony and the Montana Power Summer Symphony which chose the state's best musicians to participate in their outdoor, summer symphony. She was a dedicated viola player, which she learned in high school and excelled at the rest of her life.

Not only was she musically talented, she was tremendous ranch support for my dad and one of the

Herefords in Scotland: Douglas Family making strides with Herefords, including U.S. Bloodlines

Enthusiasts for the Hereford breed are prominent on both sides of my family. My maternal grandfather, Jimmy Basson founded the successful Wye Not Hereford stud in South Africa, and my paternal grandfather, John T. Douglas established the Ervie Hereford herd, in southwest Scotland where I grew up with my three younger sis-

tud in South Africa, ters, Ellen, Olivia and Kristina. l grandfather, John T. Chance brought the two fam

Chance brought the two families together when in 1981 my father, John S. Douglas accepted the task to tend three Hereford bulls from Britain to South

Africa. The voyage lasted four weeks on a royal mail ship with stops at Tenerife, St. Helena and Ascension Islands in the Atlantic before arriving at Cape Town. One of the bulls, Clipston Rufus, was destined to be a stock sire for my grandfather and little did my dad know that in 10 years Jimmy would be his father-in-law.

Our farm is Mains of Airies and is a 600-acre block, situated on the exposed peninsula of the Rhins of Galloway. The farm has a rocky and picturesque coastline with views on to Ireland and the Mull of Kintyre.

In 1929 my great grandfather, John Douglas, bought Mains of

most gracious hostesses I've seen. At the height of our ranch days, she would cook for a crew of about a dozen in the summers, two or three times a day. Of course this was along with all of her other endeavors such as gardening, church and musical performances but back in those days, Hereford people might just stop in for a visit, tour of the herd and a couple of meals. Mom never missed a beat. She entertained the visitors, went out with the group to look at

cattle, then cooked a delicous meal for everyone. She also attended many state and national Hereford events, meetings, tours and shows with dad.

In the fall, when our production sale was held, mom would organize and cook the sale lunch for hundreds of people, get the morning coffee and donuts going for the FFA kids and the customers, then follow it up with a post-sale get-together at the house where about 200 people would congregate. Some years she and the Chug Chug Girls were part of the entertainment for the after-sale party. While she wasn't out with the cattle every day, my mom had a lot to do with the ranch and worked closely with my dad, even travelling with him to several foreign countries on Hereford-related trips.

She was very involved in the Montana Hereford Auxiliary, 4-H and Ruby Valley Cowbelles for as long as I can remember. These groups, back in the 1960s and 1970s, were an integral part of the ranching communities in Montana. The ladies involved in these groups worked tirelessly to promote and support the Hereford and beef businesses throughout the state of Montana. A large part of the promotion and support of the Auxiliary and Cowbelles was providing what would now be called catering for a number of bull sales and other cattle events. And wow, she and her friends were good cooks plus good at public relations. They didn't just cook.

Fun loving, gracious and kind, we enjoyed lots of good times, including

several trips to Yellowstone and Glacier Park piled into the back of a pick-up with grandparents and cousins.

Of course you never knew what was going to come up on the ranch from day to day and she just rolled with whatever it happened to be. Summers were especially busy times. From what I remember, when my brother, sister and I were really little, she was the one putting us on the ponies and horses for a ride almost every day in the summer. I remember a few times when we loaded up one of the ponies with several cousins, only to be quickly unloaded. Mom just took it in stride and we crawled back on. When we were older and all working on the ranch, there was at least one cousin or young Hereford person from another state staying with us. We just melded them into the family for the

She was a wonderful, loving mother who encouraged each of us children to pursue our talents. For me, it was the pursuit of art and advertising and how to combine that with interest in cattle. I guess it worked out as I was able to combine the two endeavors for what I do today.

We received many nice messages, notes, calls and e-mails. Thank you to everyone who contacted us, expressing condolences.. It seems like the summer has not only been tough on us but a number of other Hereford families whose loved ones departed this earth too soon. Our condolences to them as well.

Special thanks to the Ruby Valley Chorale who so graciously performed one of Mom's favorite songs at her memorial service. I know she enjoyed working with all of you over the years.

I would also like to thank the staff at Marquis who so lovingly cared for her in her final days.

We will miss her so much.

Airies and moved there from Ayrshire with his wife and young family. In those days dairy and 55 acres of second-early ware potatoes were the main enterprises with much of the milk from the 140-cow herd of Ayrshires used on farm to produce cheese. There also was both a herd of sows and a weaner




A picture from the early days. John T. Douglas quickly modernized after returning to the farm after finishing school.

pig finishing enterprise, which used up both the whey from the cheese production as well as the "brock tatties."

John Douglas was a noted Clydesdale horse judge and breeder and as well as the 6 ½ pair of work horse for the farmwork there always was a top stallion and a string of brood mares at "the Airies." Sheep also featured, with a 100-ewe flock of half-breds producing Suffolk-cross butchers lambs. By the 1940s my great grandfather had taken the lease on 5 sheep farms in the southern uplands of Galloway and south Ayrshire and later bought another hill farm to expand his sheep numbers. Scottish Blackface was the breed on the hills and cull ewes and wedder lambs were often transported down from the hills by train to our local town Stranraer, and then walked the 8 miles to Mains of Airies to be fattened on tur-




Modern-day lambs at Ervie Herefords.

nips.

My grandfather, John Telfer Douglas finished his schooling and came straight to the farm. During the 1950s, '60s and '70s he moved with the times

and mechanized and modernized. The horses were replaced by tractors, the leased farms were given up for timber production, cheese was no longer made on-farm with all the milk now sold to the Stranraer creamery. Pigs became unprofitable and were replaced with a beef enterprise. The hill farm had a herd of Galloway cows and he crossed half the cows with a Hereford bull, weaning all the calves and finishing them back at Mains of Airies. The dairy herd to produce beef calves for finishing and soon the beef production became a valuable part of the farming equation at Mains of Airies.

By now John T. Douglas recognized the superior performance and fleshing of the Hereford crosses and in 1969 he established the Ervie Hereford herd when he purchased his first pedigree Hereford female, Wroxhall Daisy B36, at the large Hereford cattle sale held in Edinburgh. Initially the pedigree numbers remained under 10 cows but after the dairy was dispersed in 1979, the commercial beef cow numbers went up to 150 and the pedigree Hereford herd expanded to 25 cows, with most of the bulls sold privately to local dairy farmers.

try in 1987, he dispersed the crossbred commercial and the Ervie Hereford herd expanded to 140. A portion of the herd was bred to Aberdeen Angus bulls with the aim of breeding an alternative commercial beef suckler replacement female.

During a visit to his father-in-law's Wye Not herd in South Africa in 1993, he was greatly impressed by the progeny of American Hereford bulls and became determined to source similar genetics to improve the Ervie herd. Semen from BB Domino 1087 and a Canadian son of L1 Pacesetter was bought and used with good results. In 2002 he sourced and bought a Danish in-calf Hereford heifer with bull calf at foot. She was the result of an embryo from Ken Bieber and produced two very successful stock bulls for the Ervie herd. In 2003 another heifer from the same female line was purchased from Denmark. Her genetics also enhanced the Ervie herd.


> American Hereford bloodlines were sourced in the early 2000s which have had a positive impact on the herd. Flushes from several Line One herds in recent years have continued the forward progress.

Then in 2005 my father flew out to the Denver Stock Show where he met and chatted with Jack Holden. Jack was very helpful in overcoming the problems associated with importing fresh genetics to the UK and by December 2006 our first straight Ervie Line Ones were born from three Holden flushes.

Another friendship had been struck up in Denver with Craig and Junior Beran and two cows from their very good Line One herd were flushed for importation in 2007.

2008 saw more flushes imported from Jack Holden and also a flush bought from Mark Cooper.

Now, as well as using the imported L1 bulls across our herd we are main-(continued on page 8)

taining a herd of straight Line One females and continuing with a line breeding program to produce further stock sires ongoing. On top of this, following a stint of work experience I had with the Beran family in 2013, I am eagerly awaiting some calves from a further 2 flushes imported from B&D Herefords last year.

The majority of our bull calves are kept for our on-farm Spring Bull sale. We held our first on-farm bull auction in 2010 and commercial demand increases year on year. Bulls are produced completely naturally without pampering with emphasis on fertility

and fitness. This year we sold 50 bulls to a top of £4,500 (approx. \$7,000 U.S.) and an average of £2,300 (approx. \$3,600 U.S.).

Alongside the Hereford herd we run flocks of Texels and Romney ewes which lamb March and April.

Also, what began as a hobby for fun 15 years ago with one purchased Appaloosa mare has now become a small appaloosa stud farm, which we are developing and have begun to use for stock work. Eventually we may be able to sell a few colts!

My dad's farm policy is to keep input costs low whilst maintaining a high quality end product.

Farm labour has been reduced to one (continued on page 10)



part time worker and cropping contractors are used as required.

The farm is cropped in rotation with predominately grass leys for seven years, followed by a crop of kale, then with spring oats for two or three years and reseeded back into grass. Blends of the most productive new clover va-

rieties and incorporated into our grass mixtures producing high outputs from our grazing sward whilst reducing nitrogen fertilizer applications. By strip grazing kale over the winter we have also reduced our grass silage acreage and costs

Low cost management suits our Hereford herd and our breeding selection is driven by good fertility, longev-

Pauline was a member of the Butte Symphony for over 15 years, playing the viola. A highlight of her time with the symphony was being selected to play with the Montana Summer Symphony in Helena for three years.

Pauline was also an avid member of Toastmasters and participated in speaking events throughout Montana.

Pauline was fortunate enough to see some of the great cities of the world, mostly because of connection to the cattle and agricultural community and her travels with her husband, but also in traveling with her daughter Kathy. Those cities included London, Paris, Madrid, Rio de Janeiro, Montevideo, Buenos Aires, Honolulu, New York, San Francisco, Seattle, Denver, Phoenix, Kansas City, Chicago and Calgary, among others. Her travels also included many bull sale trips.

Pauline had a definite love of fun and adventure, especially with her family. She would take the kids and any young cousins that wanted to go, swimming, touring Yellowstone Park, skiing and any other fun activity.

Pauline and Byron's 62nd wedding anniversary was July 4, 2015.





Samuel Ted Thomas

Ted Thomas, lifelong cattleman and strong supporter of the purebred cattle industry, died May 24, 2015. He was 84. Born in Osage County, OK, April 22, 1021. Ted grapes of the strong of

1931, Ted grew up around some of the best Hereford cattle of the day.

He graduated from Cotopaxi High School, Cotopaxi, CO, in 1950. While there, he became active in 4-H, showing the Grand Champion Steer at the Colorado State Fair in 1950, before heading to Colorado A&M (now Colorado State University), where he received his Bachelor's Degree in Agriculture.

While in college, Ted was President of the Livestock Club and active in the Rodeo club. He was a member of the na-

tional champion livestock judging team. He was a member of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association and ranked third nationally in calf roping. He was also a member of the Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC.)

After college, he worked for Full-O-Pep Feeds and the Quaker Oats Co., before being called to active military duty.

Following military service in the Army, he was the merchandizing manager of the Flowing M Cattle Company, Roggan, CO. After their dispersion, he went to work for the *Record Stockman* in 1960, where he worked with purebred and commercial cattle breeders in Texas, New Mexico and Oklahoma.

In 1962 he became a field representative for the American Hereford Association, guiding seed stock producers in their herd management, sales and marketing. While there, he launched the first junior Hereford associations, in Colorado, Wyoming, Nebraska and Montana. Ted crafted the 'field day' model, combining judging contest, education, fellowship and fun for youth and their families, and state-wide events with well over 1,000 participants became the norm in the heyday of the Hereford breed.


In 1968, he took over management of Wyoming Hereford Ranch, Cheyenne, under the ownership of the Nielsen family, and remained there until the cowherd was dispersed in 1976. While there, he strengthened the genetics of the famed breeding program, winning Grand Champion Carload of Bulls at the National Western Stock Show, Denver, among other champion and grand champion bulls and females at registered Hereford shows throughout the Rocky Mountain Region.

From WHR, he returned to livestock industry publication work, with the *Dakota Farmer* and then the *Western Livestock Reporter*, Billings, MT and then the *Wyoming Livestock Roundup*, Casper, WY, while developing a seed stock consulting and order-buying business. In 1991, he expanded to offer financial planning services, specializing in protecting the ranching industry.

Ted was a nationally-recognized show cattle judge, walking the lines at the Dixie National Livestock Show, as well as other Hereford events. He served on regional and national boards for the livestock industry, including the Wyoming Fair Board Advisory Council, and was a guide and mentor to many who have risen to prominence in the livestock industry.

He remained a competitive calf-roper through much of his career, and enjoyed steer roping, then steer stopping, as his

His huge hands guided us in many projects and on few occasions they would "guide the rod of instruction on the backside" as well. But he poured himself out into his family. He enjoyed his Hereford cattle and he loved good horses. Earliest memories include those of him training colts and also of training his children how to train horses and work cattle. He was always diligent in picking up a hoe and working in the garden with his family as well. This gratification was instilled into his children, too.

Tige could be the jack of all trades, as are many in farming and ranching, but what set him apart was his love. Tige was passionate about his relationship with Jesus Christ. Due to that, his love abounded for all that crossed his path.

Budler's Hereford Champion of the World Contest

Eight Hereford cattle breeders from around the world traveled to the Lone Star State Jan. 31 to Feb. 7 to compete in the 'Hereford - Champion of the World' (COW) and 'Hereford - Miss World' competition held in conjunction with the Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo. From watching the judge award the Grand Champion Hereford at the US National Show to personal Hereford herd tours throughout the western frontier, competitors received a true 'taste of Texas' throughout the week.

Champion of the World 2014 Champions revealed

With an eager crowd gathered around the arena, each contestant stood anxiously awaiting the reveal of the 2014 World titles. After an introduction of each animal and breeder, announcer Rob Schacher called the names of top bull and female winners. Since live animals could not be easily transported from four continents to the Stock

Show, cardboard cutouts represented each winning animal. Prize money totaling \$28,000 USD was awarded to contestants- \$3000 USD for regional winners, \$5000 USD for international champions.

Fernando Alfonso, from Cabaña Las Anitas of Montevideo, Uruguay, unanimously claimed 2014 'Hereford - Champion of the World' with his bull Kamikaze. Winning the 2014 Expo Prado spring-boarded Kamikaze into the South American regional championship, inevitably securing his place among top bulls worldwide for the competition.

"[It was exciting] when they announced that our bull was the first in the world, and that it was a unanimous call," said Alfonso. "That's a real honor for us, and it pushes us forward."

Immediately after being named World Champion, Fernando was swarmed with Uruguayan media outlets. "It [is huge] news to the main newspapers and TV shows that Uruguay had the best Hereford bull this year," said Alfonso. "[Winning will be] a marketing tool to promote our whole operation worldwide.'

Cayley Brown of Perry, Saskatchewan, Canada, captured her second 'Miss World' title in three years with her female CB 122L Lady B 222Z. Lady B first won the Canadian Western Agribition before being selected as the North American regional champion female. "It's really an honor to win Miss World with how the show is run," Brown said. "It's an honor that such a broad spectrum of different views and ways of looking at cattle can appreciate what I have. It really helps for marketing."




