Demand and prices for Hereford cattle continue to increase and I think we will see that continue. We continue to see a shift in our area in respect to commercial cattlemen

2014 is about to come to a close and as I look back it's been an unbelievable run. The commercial cattle industry has been as high as I have ever

seen it in my lifetime. I have distant memories of going to Nebraska with a carload of calves and getting 17 cents a pound. The bankers that I have talked to are smiling from ear to ear and saying, "It's sure good now, but we are telling our people to put some away and don't get to extravagant with your purchases." Most of the ranchers are driving trucks and trailers that run around 100 thousand dollars and a new tractor for the average rancher is 150 thousand now. I talked

Stuber Inducted into Hereford Hall of Fame

Roger Stuber, Bowman, ND, was inducted into the Hereford Hall of Fame Oct. 31, 2014. He was recognized at the Hereford Honoree Reception during the American Hereford Association (AHA) Annual Meeting in Kansas City, MO. The Hall of Fame honor annually recognizes breeders who have dynamically influenced the direction and advancement of the Hereford breed.


Roger operates Stuber Ranch on the same land where he was born in 1940. His grandfather established the ranch there in 1909. After graduating from the University of Wyoming in 1962 he joined his brother, Richard, and father fulltime on the ranch.

Today, the operation is run by Roger, Richard's son, Duane, and his wife, Dana and their children, along with Richard's widow Laureen. Other family members include Laureen's daughter Wendy and her son Garrett Kidd.

The ranch includes about 1,000 head of cattle, with a third of them regis-

tered. Since 1969 the Stuber family has hosted an annual bull sale on the ranch the third Saturday of April.

"Without a doubt one of Roger's

greatest attributes is his honesty and dedication to the Hereford breed," says Mark Cooper of Cooper Hereford Ranch, Willow Creek, MT. "Whether it is standing by the reputation of the Stuber program or in his dealings with the American cattle industry, Roger has been a very influential voice. He has been steadfast and non-compromising in his integrity."

Roger was elected to the AHA Board in 1972 and served as president in 1977. He served on the former National Cattlemen's Association (NCA) board and served as that organization's president in 1993.

As NCA president, Roger initiated the formation of an incorporated, nonprofit, legal-defense fund to wage precedent-setting cases of importance to the U.S. beef industry in the courts. For his instrumental role in establishing the CATL (Cattlemen Advocating Through Litigation) Fund, Stuber was

We calve in April so the females are on green grass. This gives us a better idea of the udder quality of the females and puts less stress on the calves. The females winter out and calve in a 3,000-acre pasture. They are checked once a day by horse. If a cow has calving problems, a calf does not get up and nurse or if the cow cannot travel from water hole to water hole, they are eliminated. We run approximately 1,200-head of commercial females that are exposed almost

exclusively to Durbin Creek Ranch bulls. Like you, these cows are our livelihood. We cannot afford diminished calf crops, low conception rates or poor carcass traits. The registered cow herd was designed with these cows in mind so that we would know in depth the history of the cattle dictating the genetic future of the program. We have retained ownership of our calf crop for 20 years. Extensive carcass and performance data have been compiled over the years.

ters today, with plenty of help from their children and grandchildren.

Harlan and Mary Rausch, Rick and Linda Rausch, and Gary and Twila Rausch operate separate ranches and provide additional animals to the headquarters for marketing.

Rausch Herefords has topped the list

for the most Dams of Distinction each year since 1980. To date, more than 600 Rausch cows have been named Dams of Distinction.

To qualify as a Dam of Distinction a female must produce a healthy, growthy calf every year; she should calve as a 2-year-old, and she should cause her owner absolutely no problems. A Dam of Distinction is the standard by which all Hereford cows can be judged. The cow must do her job, but also her owner must manage the herd correctly to give her the opportunity to excel.

Founded in 1946, Rausch Herefords was started when William and Alice Rausch helped their oldest children sell their 4-H sheep and purchase registered Hereford heifers. At that time it was called Wm. Rausch & Sons. In 1959 the family hosted its first annual bull and female sale.

More than 200 bulls and 300 females are sold each year in the February sale

> at the ranch plus the ranch has private treaty offerings throughout the year. Each year only the top-third of Rausch bull calves are marketed. Those remaining are finished as steers and carcass data is collected to track and improve ribeye and marbling expected progeny differences (EPDs).

The Rausch breeding program annually utilizes more than 50 herd sires plus artificial insemination (AI) to constantly make genetic progress. They have been performance testing since the late 1950s when portable scales became available and have remained on the cutting edge in collecting data as more technology is developed. They were one of the first Hereford breeders in America to utilize live Internet bidding in production sales.

In 2007 Rausch Herefords was named the South Dakota Hereford Association Seedstock Producer of the Year.

Each Rausch generation has been actively involved in Hereford association activities. William Rausch was inducted into the AHA Hall of Fame in 1986. Four of his sons -Duane, Harlan, Vern and Jerry — served on the South Dakota Hereford Association board. Three of his granddaughters, Cindy, Kay and Jodi, served as South Dakota Hereford Queen.

to a local contractor this week who does a lot of work with his excavator for the local ranchers and he said that he really needed a new excavator but that one that he wanted was priced at 490 thousand dollars, so he said that he had to go with the alternative and find a better used one. The future looks bright for several years to come in the cattle business, but as most of older people would say "now is a real good time to get your house in order".

I attended the Montana Hereford Association 2014 Feeder Calf Sale last month. This sale has been a good event and the calves of all weights sold for prices that were commensurate with calves of all breeds that sold in the auction barns around the state at that time. It makes a tremendous difference when Hereford and Hereford cross calves can be offered at one location in this state.

In most of Montana's auction barns a smaller group of Herefords will get discounted, but when about 1,000 head are offered for sale at one facility the price structure equalizes, and it certainly did at the sale in Three Forks this year.

I have to give a lot of credit to the Montana Hereford Association people that were instrumental in putting this sale together. Eastern Montana Hereford breeders also have a feeder calf sale that they put on in Miles City, I was unable to attend that event, but reports to me are that the sale was very successful too, and it is very apparent to me that anyone the has straight Hereford calves to market should consign them to one of these sales.

The Hereford crossbred calves, especially the Black Angus cross, seem to sell very well wherever they are offered. However, it seems that when Herefords are crossed with other breeds, the buyers have to be fully advised as to the exact breeding of the animal before they are willing to pay the full market price. We saw this very example two years at one of the large ranches here in southwest Montana, they sell thousands of steers and had crossed a group of their Hereford cows with a Red Angus bull, when the private treaty buyers came to the ranch to buy the steers they wanted to cut that group out or discount them. The ranch manager said "No, I won't let you cut them out or discount them, I will take them to the Montana Hereford Association Sale." Those same Hereford - Red Angus cross calves topped the sale!

Ernesto Delgado is my neighbor, he came from Mexico to the US about 20 years ago and Ernesto received his American citizenship several years ago. Ernesto works for one of the largest ranches in the valley and he is a key employee for them. Ernesto is my closest ranch neighbor and a friend. About 10 days before Christmas, Ernest came







John Ascuaga was inducted into the Hereford Hall of Merit at the AHA's annual meeting in Kansas City. He was recognized at the Hereford Honorees Reception.

John owned John Ascuaga's Nugget Hotel and Casino in Reno for more than 50 years. The casino has hosted the Western Nugget National Hereford Show for more than 45 years.

The son of a Basque immigrant sheepherder, John is a self-made man who built an entertainment empire in Reno as well as a large ranching enterprise.

His father emigrated from Spain in 1914 — his wife joined him two years later — and they raised John and his three siblings on a farm in Idaho. John started in the hotel industry as a bellman in McCall, ID, while attending college.

He followed family friend, Dick

Graves to Nevada. Graves opened the Nugget in 1955, and three years of growth later, moved it across the street to its current location.

By 1960, Graves was ready to retire and sold the business for \$3,775,000 to John, who at the time was only 34 years old. He put nothing down on the loan and still managed to pay it off in seven years.

In 2007, John was honored as the Lifetime Cattleman by the Western States Hereford Association during the Western Nugget National Hereford Show and Sale in Reno.

Cheryl Thomas, Western States Hereford Association secretary/treasurer, says, "John is the reason the Western Nugget National Hereford Show and Sale takes place. It all started with a Hereford bull sale in a tent in





Nash, Deewall Families Honored as Century Breeders

In celebration of 100 years in the Hereford business, Franklin Nash & Family Herefords and Mike Deewall Family Herefords, Coldwater, KS, was honored as a Century Hereford Breeder Oct. 31. Craig Huffhines, American Hereford Association (AHA) executive vice president, presented the award to Jane Nash Deewall along with her husband, Mike Deewall; sister, Julie Nash; brother, Jeff Nash and his wife, Sherry; daughter, Dr. Kelly Deewall Shupe, and husband, Nathan; and son, Kent Deewall, and wife, Mary, at the Hereford Honorees Reception during the AHA Annual Meeting in Kansas City.

Jane's grandfather, Walter C. Nash, purchased the operation's first registered Hereford cattle in 1914. At that time the ranch was located northwest of Canon City, CO. Those cattle were of Gudgell & Simpson breeding. Walter Nash and his son, Franklin, made key purchases in the 1930s of Dominant Mischief from W.N Balyney and Advance Domino 84 from Fred C. DeBerard. Today's Deewall cattle still trace back to these two influential bulls.

Franklin Nash, Jane's father, was considered an expert in linebreeding. With the exception of his military service during WWII he spent his life working to improve the herd. One large ranch in Saguache, Colo., purchased Nash Ranch bulls for 60 straight years. That fam-

ily still buys bulls today from Jane and Mike

Jane and Mike attended Oklahoma State University, were on the livestock judging team and graduated with animal science degrees. Mike held several positions over the years, working for Turner Ranch, Oklahoma State University, Higgins Herefords, Middleswarth Herefords and LeForce Herefords.

In 1991, Mike and Jane started purchasing cattle from Jane's family. Then in 1998, they settled on the Deewall ranch south of Coldwater that had been in Mike's family since 1892. Eventually, all the Nash Herefords found their way to Kansas. Mike and Jane also run a commercial Hereford herd based on his family's cow herd genetics.

Mike worked as the Comanche County Extension Agent for eight years but recently retired, and Jane works part time for Stalcup accounting in addition to operating Nash Originals LLC, a food gift box company.



Walker Elected American Hereford Association President

In 1981 Eric purchased his first registered Hereford, and now, 30 years later, he owns and manages a herd of 125 registered Hereford cows along with his wife, Rhonda; son, Cody; and stepson, Casey.

"It will be a great honor and privilege to serve as AHA president," Eric says. "We have a great team of board members and staff who go above and beyond to make this association successful. We are all enjoying some great times in the cattle industry. The Hereford breed is positioned to move forward and hopefully take more market share with its ability to add heterosis and efficiency to a crossbreeding program."

Eric's farm has hosted 18 production sales since 1986 and Walker genetics have been sold in 32 states, as well as Canada, Mexico and the United Kingdom.

The Walker cow herd utilizes approximately 500 acres of his total 1,100-acre farming operation. The remaining 600 acres are used for the production of shade and ornamental trees and shrubs that supply products for Walker Nursery Co. Eric is the sole proprietor of Walker Nursery Co., and he sells and markets his products to the landscape and retail green industry, shipping to 35 different states.

Eric says, as with most organizations, increasing membership is a top priority. "I would also like to see an upward trend in registrations and transfers, and we can never have too much data and performance statistics," he adds. "I hope to see all the research and performance projects we have going on continue to provide information that will help breeders produce cattle that are needed in the beef industry."

Eric is a member of the Middle and East Tennessee Hereford Associations, as well as a member of the Tennessee and Warren County Cattlemen's Associations. He has been a director and president of the Tennessee Polled Hereford Association. He is also a past president of the Tennessee Nursery and Landscape Association and currently serves as secretary for the Regional Planning Commission Board for the town of Morrison.

Selected to serve as the 2015 Vice President was Sam Shaw, Caldwell, ID. Sam is a third generation Hereford breeder. The Shaw family owns and operates Shaw Cattle Co. and has been in Hereford business for 68 years.

The Shaws currently run more than 1,250 cows including registered Herefords, Angus and Red Angus. The Shaws host an annual production sale in the spring and market 500 bulls and females. They also sell bulls and females private treaty throughout the year.

They have an extensive artificial insemination (AI) program. All females are synchronized once and then heat detected for a second cycle. They also collect feed intake data using the GrowSafe program. The entire crop of bulls from their fall calving herd is placed in the program.

Sam and his wife, Janel, have three children.

Completing their terms on the

AHA Board were outgoing president Steve Lambert, Oroville, CA; Dale Venhuizen, Manhattan, MT; and Keith Fawcett, Ree Heights, SD.

Delegates elected three new directors during the membership meeting. Jim Mickelson, Santa Rosa, CA; Kevin Schultz, Haviland, KS; and Bob Thompson, Rolla, MO, will serve fouryear terms on the 12-member Board.

Jim Mickelson

California Hereford breeder Jim Mickelson and his family own and operate Sonoma Mountain Herefords, Santa Rosa. The Sonoma Mountain herd currently includes 175 head of registered Hereford cows.

In 2003 Sonoma Mountain Herefords got its start with the purchase of the remainder of the Kunde Herefords herd, which dated back to the 1940s.

Jim and his wife, Marcia, oversee the operation, while their son, Bobby, along with his wife, Heidi, is in charge of day-to-day activities and is the ranch's herdsman. Jim and Marcia's daughter, Jamie, is involved as well; she's responsible for the show string. The Mickelson family shows cattle at local, regional and national shows including the National Western Stock Show in Denver.

Bulls are marketed each year as long yearlings or 2-year-olds in the ranch's production sale, held in conjunction with Lambert Ranch for the past eight years. Select bulls are consigned to the Red Bluff Bull Sale, where Sonoma Mountain has had several champion and reserve champion bulls. Just recently the Mickelsons have begun marketing females to commercial and

registered breeders.

Sonoma Mountain Herefords has been a Gold Total Performance Record (TPR) Breeder for several years. In 2007 the operation was selected as the California Beef Cattle Improvement Association Seedstock Producer of the Year.

To educate the public, the Mickelsons operate sustainable tours in conjunction with their winery operation so that the public can see firsthand how the cattle are raised, including during calving season.

Jim not only operates Sonoma Mountain Herefords but also serves as president of Kunde Family Vineyards, is on the Kunde Family Winery board of directors and is president and chief operating officer of Jerry and Don's Yager Pump and Well, a water well pump and drilling business, which he purchased in 1984.

Jim recently served as one of the spokespersons for the CHB program. He has also served as the California-Nevada Hereford Association president and was on the merger committee for that association. He has been a junior advisor for the California-Nevada Junior Hereford Association and has served as the Western States Hereford Association show and sale director and as a director and president of the Sonoma Marin Fair. He was

also a member of the AHA nominating committee.

Kevin Schultz

Kansas Hereford breeder Kevin Schultz, Haviland, KS, manages his family's Sandhill Farms, a sevengeneration, diversified farming and cattle operation. His family has a deep history in the Hereford business as Hereford cattle have been bred on their land since the mid-1900s.

The farming operation consists of dryland and irrigated corn, soybeans and wheat.

The cow herd includes about 300 cows. With the maturity of Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acres, the Schultz family is in an expansion phase. Through the use of ET, approximately 200 of the calves are registered, and the balance will be purebred commercial. The commercial cows have been purebred Hereford since the mid-1940s.

The family has fed out its steers at commercial feedlots for the past 15-20 years. Feedlot performance data, as well as individual carcass data, have been collected and tracked.

The registered program was started after Kevin graduated from Kansas State University in 1986, and from then until 2008, all Sandhill bulls were sold private treaty. In 2008 the family started a spring bull sale. In the sale all 5-year-old cows that are pregnant with heifer calves sell. The Schultz family also sells commercial open heifers and

customer-owned black baldy heifers each year in the sale.

Sandhill genetics have been part of the National Reference Sire Program (NRSP) and the Circle A Ranch heterosis project. Kevin uses these programs to increase the accuracy and predictability of his bulls and to identify outliers that will help move the breed in the desired direction. Sandhill Farms is a Gold TPR Breeder; the family has been whole-herd reporting since the beginning of its registered cattle program.

Kevin's goals are to provide genetics to his customers that will enhance their profits and their satisfaction of the Hereford genetics that Sandhill provides. In the past two sales, 70% of the bulls were sold to commercial buyers, and the other 30% to registered breeders.

For the last 19 years, Sandhill Farms has exhibited a pen of bulls at the National Western Stock Show in Denver.

Kevin was a longtime member of the Kansas Polled Hereford Association, serving multiple terms on the board and as president. He is a current member of the Kansas Hereford Association. In 2004 he was AHA's nominee to the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) Young Cattlemen's Conference. Sandhill Farms was honored with the Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) Seedstock Producer of the Year Award in 2010.

Kevin has served on numerous local and state boards, being an officer in most. These include church, school, groundwater management, Extension, Farm Bureau, the Kansas Livestock Association and others.

Kevin and his wife, Vera, have three children — Brooke, Tyler and Courtney.

Bob Thompson

Involved in production agriculture all his life, Bob Thompson along with his wife, Gretchen, own and operate Glengrove Farm near Rolla, MO.

The farm was a registered Jersey dairy farm from 1926 until the mid-1960s. Bob's family has owned the land since 1903, and the Thompsons started their registered Hereford herd in 1974.

They began performance testing through the University of Missouri Livestock Extension Service and the American Polled Hereford Association in 1976. The current Glengrove herd consists of approximately 50 cows and has been developed through the extensive use of AI and, in recent years, the use of ET. Their production goals center on producing diversified genetics that will meet the needs of their purebred and commercial customers and perform in their environment on fescue grass.

The Thompsons market cattle through the Show-Me Hereford Classic sales in April and November. They also consign to the "Missouri Opportunity" state sale. In addition to the

Hereford cattle, they own a corn and soybean row cropping operation in north Missouri near Princeton.

Bob and Gretchen are also part owners in a small investment group that has recently broken ground on a new backgrounding feedlot to add value for local feeder calf producers.


Bob is a past president of the Missouri Hereford Association (MHA) and was inducted into the MHA Hall of Fame in 2011. Glengrove Farm was honored with the MHA Purebred Breeder of the Year award in 2012. 

Kurt William Gilmore


Kurt Gilmore, beloved husband of Maxine, passed away on December 18, 2014 as a result of cancer, at the age of 65 years.

American IVF Bovine Embryos Now Allowed to Enter Canada

Nov. 5, 2014 — Canada's Agriculture Minister Gerry Ritz announced his country's cattle producers will now have better access to top quality bovine genetics following a new agreement with the United States. The agreement, which allows in-vitro fertilized (IVF) bovine embryos to enter Canada from the U.S., opens up new herd development opportunities for Canadian producers. Previously, only IVF bovine embryos produced within Canada were accessible to producers.

Canada and the U.S. have a strong bilateral trading relationship in bovine genetics, working together to increase North American bovine genetics competitiveness. To build on these important trade ties, this certificate represents the first agreement Canada has developed with another country to permit the sale of IVF bovine embryos within our market.

"We all agree that Canadian producers raise the highest quality cattle and are always striving to produce the best genetics in the world," said Minister Ritz. 

Horned • Polled • Scurred – The Science, The Facts & the Reminders

The following questions are answered by Dr. Sheila Schmutz, with additional commentary and deductions by the author, with Schmutz's guidance.

Dr. Schmutz is a considered a leader in the field of animal genetics. She is a professor in the Department of Animal and Poultry Science at the University of Saskatchewan and is a researcher of international acclaim. Areas of interest and specialty include genetics of horns and scurs in cattle.

If cattle are scurred, does that mean they are horned?

"No."

Can a horned animal also be scurred?

"Well....yes....A horned animal can have the gene that says it should have scurs but since horns and scurs grow in exactly the same location, if the animal already has horns, then it can't grow scurs too."

Can a polled animal be scurred?

"Yes. That's why some cattle people prefer to say "smooth polled" (in the absence of scurs) to be clear that the animal is polled, without scurs."

What is a heterozygous polled or horned animal?

"The term "heterozygous" means that the animal carries only one copy of one allele and one copy of the opposite allele. A heterozygous polled or horned animal would therefore be labeled (P/p)."



The animal may or may not have scurs. But only heterozygous polled cattle ever grow scurs. Two scurred al-

leles are required in females and only one in males, making this a sex-influ-

A heterozygous polled animal is polled but still carries the horned allele and can therefore pass horns along to progeny. On the other hand, a heterozygous horned animal is also polled but can influence its progeny to be either polled or horned.

What is a homozygous polled or horned bull?

The term "homozygous" means that the animal carries two copies of one allele (either the polled or horned), ensuring that genetically, that animal is absolutely polled or absolutely horned. If an animal is known to be either homozygous polled (P/P) or homozygous horned (p/p), it will not have scurs but each can still have one or two alleles for scurs.

A homozygous polled animal can only influence its progeny to be polled while a homozygous horned animal can only influence its progeny to be horned (keeping in mind that progeny's horned status is also influenced by the dam or sire on the other side of the equation).

Some ranchers use the term "double polled" to mean that the animal is descendent from two polled parents. But this does not ensure the progeny will be homozygous polled, or even polled at all.

However, mating two homozygous horned animals will ensure homozygous horned progeny (p/p x p/p can only result in p/p offspring).

HORNS

According to an early study of fetal anatomy in Germany, horns seem to begin growth at four months gestation. But in many breeds, horn buds are very tiny at birth. If left unremoved, horns continue to grow in size throughout the life of the animal.

POLLED

Polled is an autosomal dominant trait in cattle. Autosomal genes are

genes present on any chromosome other than the sex chromosome. And because it is dominant, it only requires that one parent has passed it on, in order for it to be expressed in progeny.

The gene causing the absence of horns is at the top of cattle chromosome 1.

Scientists use the term "epistatic." Epistasis is the suppression of one gene by the effect of another gene. The homozygous polled genotype (P/P) is completely epistatic to the gene for scurs in both sexes.

SCURS

The gene for scurs is located on a completely different chromosome (chromosome 19), than the gene for polled.

Scurs typically do not appear until about four months of age and stop growing at a few inches, if left on.

"If dehorning occurs too early, scurs

can be missed," says Schmutz.

Some scurs, often called "scab scurs" are never much bigger than a thumbnail. Horn growth makes it impossible for scurs to develop at the same spot but horned animals can carry the gene for scurs.

Traditionally, the scurred trait has been reported as sex-influenced. Male cattle need only one allele for scurs to exhibit the trait, whereas females need two alleles.

All female cattle that have scurs are considered to be homozygous scurred (Sc/Sc). But males can either be homozygous scurred (Sc/Sc) or heterozygous scurred (Sc/sc), if they have

ASSOCIATED PERFORMANCE **TRAITS**

As Larry Thomas reported in the December 2000 Canadian Cattlemen magazine, University of Alberta professor Mick Price and others looked back on historic records of its Kinsella synthetic beef herd, comparing polled and horned cattle on growth, carcass

and reproductive traits. "These and other studies found no major differences," he says.

Definitions:

Polled

The name for the absence of horns in cattle.

Scurs

Small horn-like growths on the frontal bone in the same locations where horns would grow. Scurs are referred to as "wiggle horns" in German and indeed, most are movable and are not attached firmly to the skull.

Allele

One of two or more alternative forms of a gene that arise by mutation and are found at the same place on a chromosome.

Examples for the polled gene and scurred gene:

P = polled allele p = horned allele Sc = scurred allele sc = allele for no scurs

AHA Releases New Udder EPDs

With the release of the spring 2015 Pan-American Cattle Evaluation (PACE), the American Hereford Association (AHA) has released two new expected progeny differences (EPDs) for udder quality.

The two traits — udder suspension (UDDR) and teat size (TEAT) — were first released on the web. You can find them by going to Hereford.org and clicking on "EPD Search." They are located in the EPD trait box positioned right after mature cow weight (MCW). This first release will be the trait by itself with no correlations to other traits, and there will not be a genomic impact with genomic enhanced-expected progeny differences (GE-EPDs).

According to Jack Ward, AHA chief operating officer and director of breed improvement, there were around 200 000 udder observations included in the first evaluation, and the heritability for both UDDR and TEAT is about .34, which makes this trait fairly highly heritable, so genetic progress can be made rather quickly.

"The correlation between the two scores and one is .72, so it makes all udder scores useful in this evaluation," Ward says. "This EPD can be used the same as other EPDs and will allow you to compare animals and, most importantly, has the potential to change udder quality between sire groups."

In July 2008 the Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) adopted a two-score system for evaluating udders. The AHA Board of Directors followed suit and adopted the same system during its August 2008 meeting. See the "Udder Scoring Fact Sheet" posted in the Hereford.org "Education Center."

Scores of 1 to 9 are used for both traits with 9 being more close to ideal. "This scoring system is not concerned with milk flow or production; those will be measured with the weaning weight (WW) and milk and growth (M&G) EPDs," Ward explains. "All we are looking at with this trait is the type of udder and teat."

Udder suspension

Scores range from 9 (very tight) to 1 (very pendulous) and represent assessments of udder support. Weak udder suspension results in pendulous udders that make it difficult for a calf to nurse.

Weak suspension in the udder indicates a lack of support in the ligament that ties the udder to the cow's body wall. Over time, weakness in this ligament will allow the udder to hang down too far from the body and may subject the udder to serious problems and increased potential for injury.

UDDR EPDs are reported on the scoring scale. Differences in sire EPDs predict the difference expected in the sires' daughters' udder characteristics when managed in the same environ-

For example, if sire A has a UDDR EPD of 0.4, and sire B has a UDDR EPD of -0.1, the difference in the values is 0.5, or one-half of a score. If daughters of sires A and B are raised and managed in the same environment, you would expect half a score better udder suspension in daughters of sire A, compared to sire B.

Teat size

Scores range from 9 (very small) to 1 (very large, balloon shaped) and are subjective assessments of the teat length and circumference. Oversized teats are difficult for newborn calves to nurse, and the calf may not receive adequate colostrum. This could lead to a higher incidence of scours or decreased immunity levels in the newborn calf.

TEAT EPDs are reported on the scoring scale. Differences in sire EPDs predict the difference expected in the



predict the difference expected in the sires' daughters' udder characteristics when managed in the same environment

For example, if sire A has a teat size EPD of 0.4, and sire B has a teat size EPD of -0.1, the difference in the values is 0.5, or one-half of a score. If daughters of sires A and B are raised and managed in the same environment, you would expect half a score smaller teat size in daughters of sire A, compared to sire B.

Just like with the scoring system, the higher the EPD the better for both traits.

"These are important traits to analyze because commercial producers demand genetics that are problemfree," Ward says. "The loss of time, longevity and calf performance due to a poor quality udder cannot be tolerated."

With the release of spring 2015

EPDs, the updated Trends, Traits and Distributions report is now also available online at Hereford.org.

"The Association's role is to give our members tools to make improvement in beef production," Ward adds. "Udder EPDs are the next phase in breed improvement strategies that will allow our members to continue to improve the genetics they produce."

Submitting scores

Hereford breeders record udder scores on the Registration Application/ Birth Information Worksheet (Form 1).

According to Jack Ward with the new system, breeders will list the score in the same field used previously, but instead of recording one score, they will input the two digits. The first digit will be the udder suspension (attachment) score, and the second digit will be teat size. For example, if a cow has an attachment score of 7 and a teat size of 5, the breeder will record 75 in the "dam udder score" column.

Research shows udder and teat characteristics are heritable; thus, change can be made through selection.

Udder quality represents one of the most important convenience traits in commercial beef production. Some would argue that udder quality represents an economic trait as poor udders require additional labor inputs and thereby decrease profitability.

Seedstock producers should manage udder quality closely, says Bob Weaber, University of Missouri Extension

beef genetics specialist. "Your commercial customers expect trouble-free cattle when they make a purchase at your farm or ranch. Don't give your customers a reason to buy genetics from another source to 'clean up' udders produced by your bulls."

Cows with good udder quality not only take less labor but also may have improved longevity due to lower incidence of mastitis or injury. "Poor udders, especially large teat size, may delay timely colostrum intake by calves, resulting in poorer transmission of pas-

Hereford Association (AHA) to be utilized in genetic evaluation. "Consistent and steady progress can make dramatic improvements in udder quality," Weaber says. "Help yourself and your customers by selecting for and culling on udder quality. Improving and monitoring udder traits will pay dividends in the long run."





Woodcrest Farms Wins South Dakota Seedstock Producer of the Year

Stability in the breed and stability in their family has kept Del and Ruth Wood active in the Polled Hereford cattle business for over 65 years. This longevity and success was recognized by their peers at the South Dakota Hereford Association Annual Meeting (SDHA) and Banquet, Nov. 9th, in Brookings, SD. The Wood family was honored with the 2014 SDHA Seedstock Producer of the Year. Woodcrest Farms joined the South Dakota Hereford Association in 1958 and are American Polled Hereford Association and the American Hereford Association life-time members. Del and Ruth were also instrumental in forming the Mid-Dakota Polled Hereford Association in 1966 and Del served as its first president.

Long-time love for Herefords

Del always had a soft spot in his heart for Polled Hereford cattle. His dad raised commercial Polled Herefords but Del had it in his mind that when he was old enough to start his herd it was going to be a registered herd.

That started at a young age of 14 in 1947. He wanted to show Polled Herefords in 4-H and started to build a small herd until he went off to college, then he served in Japan from 1955-1957 During this time Rol Odland, a neighboring Polled Hereford breeder. kept his small herd intact. Del couldn't wait to get back to South Dakota to build a cow herd, which he did by purchas-

ing females from reputable registered Polled Hereford breeders.

At this time Del noticed a fellow 4-Her and sister of long-time a friend who also had a soft spot for cattle. Del and Ruth were married in 1963. From that point on the two had so much pride for the Polled Hereford cattle they can't imagine what their life would have been like without the people they met and the pride they had in raising good cattle. For most of their years in the business their herd consisted of 100 cows and today, that number is just slightly lower due to them trying to slow down a little bit at their age.

Ruth and Del enjoying a sunny day checking the cattle and have done so together since 1963.

Foundation herd sires included: Silver Beau 1st who was purchased from Grass Lake Ranch, Mansfield, SD; GH Beau Perfect 33rd, from Gullickson Herefords, Bath, SD; and Choice Gold, from Harry Witt, Butler, SD. These sires were the basis of the Woodcrest herd and resulted in producing a cowherd with longevity and quality.


Disposition and milking ability were two of the main parameters they selected for over the years. They culled hard for these traits and it paid off because their bull buyers came back year after year to purchase Woodcrest bull's with that great disposition. For years, the Woods continued sold bulls private treaty. They built up their reputation by attending many of the state Hereford sales in communities such as Huron, Watertown. Brookings, Aberdeen, Mitchell, Rapid City selling their genetics and buying a few from fellow breeders as well.

In 1977 they held their first bull and female sale on the ranch. They did this for four years, but went back to the private treaty sales, because they could keep costs down and still had enough demand to sell directly off the ranch. In Del's 1977 sale catalog welcome letter he emphasized how active they had been with performance testing, doing so with Guide Lines records since 1958.

When the continental cattle were introduced to the U.S., the Woods did see a decline in demand for Hereford cattle. "Everyone wanted to try new genetics," Ruth says. But in time, those breeders were soon back selecting bulls at Woodcrest because they missed the disposition, the longevity and the adaptability of the Polled Herefords. Their major source of income is from their cattle, so as Del explains, times were tough when Herefords were not as popular, but we held on and it paid off. They prefer to sell bulls at two years of age as they believe in giving the bulls a chance to grow out before they are used in a herd and their customers found this to be the case too. They are also proud to have sold semi loads of registered female's private treaty all over the nation.

In the 1980s they bred the top 20-30% of their herd A.I. to try out some new and popular bloodlines. One bull heavily used in their program was Jus-

to Justa Banner. Prior to that Woodcrest culled hard in their program and offered the top bulls to their customers, kept enough bulls to breed their own herd and then sold the remaining bulls as steer calves in January after backgrounding them out for 90 days.

Family involvement runs deep

The Woods raised three children, two girls and one boy. "We can proudly say that all our children went to college at South Dakota State University, all stayed in South Dakota and all are raising cattle today," Del says. The children were a lot of help with chores and managing the cattle until they went off to college, Ruth says, and now today with us getting older, son Steven and his four boys do all the fieldwork and help us out with the chores of bigger tasks when we need them. Del and Ruth took the children to many junior shows over the years and they attended a couple National Junior Shows with cattle and once when daughter Wendy was queen.

Daughter Cindy married Darwin Aman and they have three boys. The Amans raise Polled Herefords under the name of Hillsview Farms at Eureka. Cindy currently serves on the board of directors of the SDHA.

Daughter Wendy married Vaughn

Thorstensen of Selby and they have a large registered Gelbvieh/Balancer/ Angus herd and four daughters. They mainly show Gelbvieh and Angus cattle now in 4-H, but Wendy always loved her Polled Herefords.

Son Steven is married to Rene and they have four boys. Steven lives nearby the home ranch and helps out his parents often and even runs some of his cattle with Del and Ruth. Steven's boys are very interested in the cattle, especially Hunter and Seth. They assist regularly with maintenance of the herd.

What's ahead

"We feel pretty confident that the 5th generation will come along and take over the operation and keep the Woodcrest name active in the South Dakota cattle industry," says Del. "Yes, we hear talk of interest often from the younger generation," Ruth comments.

As for Del, so long as he has his John Deere Gator he can check the cattle on the cold winter days or travel out to the
