Rausch Herefords Top Dams of Distinction List for 35th Year

KANSAS CITY, MO. – For 2015, 2,385 Hereford cows from 646 Hereford performance herds in 40 states earned the honor of being named a Dam of Distinction by the American Hereford Association (AHA).

For 35 years Rausch Herefords, Hoven, SD, has led Hereford breeders with the most cows qualifying as Dams of Distinction. With 427 cows recognized, South Dakota is the top state again this year.

The 2015 Dams of Distinction list honors the Hereford breed's cows that meet the highest standard of production and recognizes the cattlemen who produce them. In order to be named a Dam of Distinction, a Hereford cow must meet all the job requirements for an ideal cow. She should produce a healthy, growthy calf every year; she should calve as a 2-year-old, and she should cause her owner absolutely no

problems. A Dam of Distinction is the standard by which all Hereford cows can be judged.

The cow must do her job, but also her owner must manage the herd correctly

to give her the opportunity to excel. Only a small portion of active cows is recognized. All heifers have the potential of being a Dam of Distinction, but only (continued on page 6)

In Vitro Fertilization Offers New Options for Cattle Reproduction


Imagine producing 20 to 25 calves out of your favorite cow and best bull every single year. Soon, your entire herd could be share the genetics of your very best cattle year after year. With the technology of in vitro fertilization (IVF) this is a possibility.

"You can raise a lot of high end cattle very quickly," said Warren Woroniecki, a third generation rancher from Western North Dakota and owner and operator of Prairie Nutrition.

IVF is a process that involves collecting oocytes from a donor cow, returning them to a lab where they will be fertilized, then transferring an embryo, fresh or frozen, into a recipient cow. This process is somewhat similar to conventional embryo transfer (ET), but with more advantages.

"One of the main advantages is that you will be keeping that donor female as a functional female in your herd," said Jenna Barkhurst, Customer Service Coordinator at ORIgen Embryo Technologies (OET), a full service ET facility near Huntley, MT.

Unlike conventional ET, where oocyte (egg) collection can only occur every 45 to 60 days per cow, IVF allows collection every 21 days, even

from bred female. As long as the ovaries can be reached, oocytes can be pulled from the cow. This means there are only about four months out of the year, just prior to calving, that the female cannot be collected. She can begin collection again as soon as ten days postpartum. This has been a big selling point for IVF versus conventional ET for many producers.

"It allows you to take one of your

as one of the great sales of 2016. That afternoon we motored on back to Bozeman to get ready to attend the Cooper sale at Willow Creek. It was necessary that we get to the sales early because Jill had bids for buyers, which meant we needed time to look the cattle over. The Cooper sale was also a 50th anniversary sale and even though it was a different type of sale than Holdens, it will still be one of the great sales that we record in the Hereford annals of 2016. Now I would like to tell you some of "the rest of the story."

In the 1960s Les Holden called me one day and said that he would like to come down and look at our Evan Mischief cattle, and talk about using some of each of our bloodlines in each other's herds. I told Les I would be very happy to have him come down, and he came in a few days, we spent a long day together talking about cattle and looking over our Evan Mischief line. (The Evan Mischief cattle go back to Advance Domino as do the Line Ones.

At that time Les was just starting into the Line One cattle from Miles City and had just started with one of their first sales in Stanford, MT. This was a sale that happened before any of the family talks about their 50th anniversary, this sale was held with Les Holden, Jack Cooper and a few other members of the Montana Performance Association, and Phyllis Cooper was the secretary of the Montana Performance Group. It was interesting because at that time I believe that the sale averaged about \$450.00 for Coopers and Holdens. Les was interested in our sale because that year our average was over \$800.00.

It was good that we got together to talk things over about the Evan Mischief and Line One cattle. Les said that even though he really liked our cattle he would like to go home and talk to Ray Woodward, who was the top Line One man at Miles City at that time, and was advising Les and Jack with the cattle. Les told me he would get back to me in a short time and let me know what they decided to do. I told Les that would be fine and I appreciated him coming down and I enjoyed his visit and showing him the cattle.

It was quite interesting to me that Les had come to me first even though I knew that Les was working with Jack Cooper and the Miles City group. Ray Woodward was the brother-in-law of Jack Cooper, therefore they had quite a connection with the Line One cattle at Miles City.

I might mention it was an interesting thing the way the involvement at Miles City and the experiments they wanted to do with cattle and the Hereford cattle performance. Most of the performance in those days was determined on rate of gain. They had picked up some very different pedigrees of cattle throughout the United States for the evalu-

ations, and gave them all a "Line" and a number. Of course, the ones that they brought in for the Line One were the Advance Dominos that went back to an industry prominent herd of Advance Domino cattle in Colorado. These were some of the top cattle in the U.S. at that time.

From there on the experiment station evolved the Line Ones and they were the top gaining, performing cattle, at that time of the varied lines that Miles City used in the Hereford breed.

Les called me back in about a month and told me that even though he liked our cattle and even though he thought they would be a good cross with each other, he would keep going in the Line Ones and he, Ray and Jack thought they should continue with the straight Line One breeding. They had great faith that it would evolve into one of the good lines of Hereford cattle in the U.S. It was very interesting at the time because about all of the extremely good cattle out of the Miles City Experiment Station went into the Cooper and Holden herds. The experimenting that was done at Miles City greatly accelerated the growth that the Coopers and Holdens were able to do with their cattle.

Even though Miles City basically

had run the cattle on very severe conditions and had tested them through growth and rate of gain, when the Cooper and Holdens got the cattle they started to change the cattle in a lot of ways, and the cattle were much superior to what Miles City had been originally producing. It was also very interesting that at about the same time that Coopers and Holdens had decided to go their own way, and eventually go into their first sale in Great Falls, MT, the Evan Mischief line had accelerated development, we had sold some of the top Evan Mischief cattle to the Fra-



turn sold some of their top cattle to the Deschmaeker herd in Boyd, MT. The Deschmaeker herd became one of the great herds of cattle in the U.S. with the Evan Mischiefs. They won a lot of the major show awards, were some of the top nationally selling cattle and were recognized as one of the top cow herds in the U.S. The sales would indicate this factor, because the "big boys" in the breed would show up at the Cooper and Holden sales and at Deschmaeker's, too, and they usually bought from these herds.

At the same time that Deschmaeker was doing so well, the Cooper-Holden sale was picking up momentum. In the 1970s the Cooper-Holden and Deschmaeker herds were probably recognized as the top cow herds in the U.S., at least by many of the experts interested in horned Herefords at the time. It was very interesting that at the peak of his career, Deschmaeker decided to disperse the herd, so they were consequently scattered all over the world. In the meantime Cooper and Holden had kept continuing their growth and prominence in the breed with Line Ones. They went on with the sales in Great Falls for several years before they decided it was time for them both to go to their home ranches with their own sales, so Jack Cooper took his cattle to Willow Creek and had his sale and


Les Holden was back at their ranch in Valier for their sale. In this period of time with the Line Ones, as Les was starting to age somewhat, his sons each felt that they would like to go on their own, and each of them got into their own purebred operation, one of them actually went into Hereford and then on to Red Angus and drifted away from their home ranch. John went on into a successful polled operation, however it was interesting that Les' grandson, (John's son) Jack, became a favorite of Les, and started to go with him at a very young age, and became attracted to the cattle. Les and Jack had a real bond that grew into a great thing for both and probably the Hereford industry too, because Jack grew up as young boy on the ranch and gradually came into the prominence that he now has, as one of the good breeders of Hereford cattle in the country. Now Jack and Tresha have a son and a daughter working to carry on the Holden operation. Jack was born the year Les Holden and Jack Cooper had their first sale!

It was about the same thing that was happening in Willow Creek with the son of Jack Cooper and his wife, Phyllis. Mark was now growing up on the ranch and becoming more interested in the Hereford operation. Mark went on to school at Montana State and after, came home to work with his Dad, and he eventually would take over the Hereford operation. It is really very interesting that two herds with great breeders were fortunate enough to have a son and a grandson that could come on and carry on with a line of cattle that they originally started and have done so well in the purebred industry. It's kind of an unusual story and yet I think it's an interesting story of how a lot of this evolved.

A few highlights that came out of all of the evolvement of the Cooper-Holden story is that when Cooper and Holden were first working with the

auction at Stanford, MT, a rancher by the name of Jim Fiedler was one of their best customers. Jim believed in the program that started in Miles City and he was one of the first good customers of Coopers and Holdens, and ended up with a good share of the top bulls from those herds. It was very interesting in the 1970s when I was on the American Hereford Association board with Alfred Meeks that Alfred heard about the Line One concept, and how it was growing. So he took a trip up to Montana and looked up this big operator Jim Fiedler, and spent a day with him. He finally talked him out of a bull that he wanted to take back with him to his herd in Nebraska, All of you that read Hereford America know what the Meeks' have done through the years, and again we are in the third generation of the Meeks family, but Alfred was one of the first that started to

use the Line One bulls in that famous herd in Nebraska.

You also might be interested to know that the Jim Fiedler that I referred to is from one of the good big ranches in central Montana, is the father of Jan Ward of the Ned and Jan Ward operation in Sheridan, WY.

These are interesting items that I thought you would like to know. So now you now some of the "rest of the story" of the Cooper and Holden rise to fame.

I had an unusual experience happen the other day at the Cooper sale, as I was walking out into the yard to look at the bulls. Two nice young people about five or six years old, and I know they were grandkids of Mark and Cristy Cooper, came over to me and asked me who I was. I told them and asked them who they were, and they told me, and they said, "are you here to buy cattle?" I told them I didn't know, it would depend on how much

they would cost. The little boy said "Well, I hope you can buy cattle, we surely have some good cattle here." And I said "Well, I know you do have good cattle here and it will probably depend on how much I can bid to buy some to the cattle." I told them it was nice to meet them, see you around and they told me it was nice to meet you, too and glad you came and I hope you buy some of our cattle, because we really have good cattle! I told them it was very good of them to say that. I talked to Cristy later and told her, "You have really trained these grandkids of yours to sell at a young age and you've done a great job of teaching them of how to promote your cattle."

As Cristy usually does, she just laughed and said, "Well, I don't know about that, but they are pretty active." They were a cute little pair of kids and it's sure nice to see some of the grand-kids in an operation like Coopers that are interested and care about what is




Les Holden (left) and auctioneer Pat Goggins going over the sale order.

What a great American success story this is, two good men started in tough times, paid the dues, built their herd to premier status, passed on to three generations. But remember the dollar now is worth about 20 times more than 50 years ago. A new Chevy then was about \$1800.

That's a wonderful way to celebrate a long stretch of Hereford business that will continue into the future. Congratulations to these families.

Dad and I got in some great conversation during our drive to and from Holden's sale and covered a lot of Hereford history during the drive. The next day we were joined by my sister Kathy and cousin Howie Lemm at the Cooper sale. a small percentage fit the job description of an ideal cow year in and year out.

In order for a cow to be named a 2015 Dam of Distinction she must have: 1) Weaned a calf born since 1/1/14.

- 2) Produced at least three calves.
- 3) Initially calved at 30 months of age
- 4) Had an interval between the first and second calves of no greater than 400 days. In addition, a 370-day calving interval must have been maintained after her second calf. The longer initial calving interval allows breeders to calve 2-year-old heifers prior to the mature
- 5) Every calf produced that was born before June 30, 2015, must have weaning records submitted to the Hereford Performance Program.
- 6) A progeny average 205-day adjusted weaning weight ratio of at least 105.

For more information about the Dams of Distinction Program visit Hereford.org/seedstock/damsdistinction. Females attaining the Dams of Distinction status are recognized with "DOD" after their names on the AHA website

Sires of Distinction

Also recognized are Sires of Distinction. The Sires of Distinction program recognizes superior Hereford bulls. The AHA Board of Directors initiated the program in August 2007 to recognize Hereford bulls that sire efficient, fertile and productive females. To be honored as a Sire of Distinction a bull must have produced daughters that have received at least seven Dams of Distinction awards.

Bulls attaining the Sire of Distinction status are recognized with "SOD" after their names when doing an animal or EPD inquiry at Hereford.org.

good cows, keep her in the breeding rotation, make her calve on time, plus harvest a tremendous amount of potential eggs. So that's what sold me after doing two years of super ovulation with my own cows," Woroniecki said.

Consequently, embryo production is generally higher when using IVF.

"She may make less embryos per session, but we can collect every three weeks so the final number will actually be higher," said Senior Operations Director at OET, Ricardo Tiveron.

Another bonus with IVF is the simplicity of the process. Unlike conventional ET, there are no shots involved with IVF. The cow is only brought into the chute one time in order to collect the oocytes. This saves the owner time and significantly reduces cow stress.

"I know from a labor standpoint, we'd be fools not to try this because it's just so labor unintensive and so easy on your cows," Woroniecki said.

Reducing the shots and stress on the cow keeps them in much better shape as well.

"We find a lot of cows really fat from conventional ET, then she's hard to breed," Tiveron said.

place conventional ET on many operations.

"IVF is going to take the place of a big part of conventional ET, mainly because to flush, you have to keep the cow open. You have to take that cow out of production and it can just ruin cows," OET General Manager, Michael Rea said.

Furthermore, from a semen standpoint, IVF is much more practical. One straw of semen can cover eight to ten cows, depending on semen quality and concentration. With conventional ET, as many as four to five straws may be needed per collection. So IVF may be a better route, especially when using semen that may be hard to come by.

"You can use very expensive and rare semen, just a piece of that straw, so you can cover up to four sessions," Tiveron said.

With all the advantages that IVF carries, it seems like an obvious decision. However, conventional ET still shows a slightly higher conception rate across the board. On average, success rates with conventional ET can range from fifty to seventy percent while IVF success rates are between thirty and fifty percent. There are also some cows that may seem to work better with one process than the other, leaving a demand for conventional ET among some producers.

There are many variables involved that contribute to the success rates of both methods. The transfer process is a crucial step in the whole process and that may be where rates are decreasing.

"It depends a lot on the farm side, no pregnancy may not be because of the embryo, but because of the recipient side and the stage that she is in," Tiveron said.

Producers using embryo transfer are finding this as well. Woroniecki credits a large part of his high conception rates to the nutritional health of the female at the time of transfer.

"On my own cows, I worked

with putting in conventional eggs and I've also worked with in vitro eggs and right now, there is no difference in the success of pregnancy in my own herd. We're roughly in that sixty-some percent range of embryos that stuck in the last two years," Woroniecki said.

Since this is a relatively new process for many producers, there is a learning curve involved and with time, success rates should improve as producers and technology both evolve with experience.

"We're in the learning process, mainly for our own herd, but also for my nutrition business to learn what we need to do nutritionally to make this a success," Woroniecki said.

As producers learn more about IVF and technologies improve, it is quickly gaining steam in the registered indus-


entional eggs and in vitro eggs and to propagate genetics that are proving profitable, for not only for the owner's herds to sixty-some per-


"I'm tailoring a cow that fits what I need here," Woroniecki said. "That's high growth and good genetics, tailoring their frame size, tailoring their potential. I'm actually trying to propagate what few registered cows I have that fit that. If I have to go through the same amount of work of sticking semen into a normal cow, I'm just going to stick an embryo in and produce more, better cows, faster, with the cows that I like that fit our environment."

Through Prairie Nutrition, Woroniecki works with many registered outfits of all breeds, frame sizes and genetic goals. He is an advocate

for the IVF program and says he sees it as a great way to utilize the lower percentile of the herd by using them as the recipient herd, quickly building the entire herd up to resemble the higher end cattle within the bunch.

"I've brought a lot of new concepts to my customer base and this is just another one I'm going to bring to them. I'll say 'hey, instead of spending a lot of time and money on semen and AI, why don't we take some of your bet-

ter cows and some of the top bulls and use your own herd as the recip herd?'," Woroniecki said. "I really encourage the smaller registered operations whom maybe have never worked with a donor, embryo, or recip program to do just that. You know, your one or two top cows - use your herd to propagate them."

This concept, along with the numerous advantages of IVF, the technological advancements, and the convenience of use are all contributing to the growing demand for this program.

"Most people have heard about it before but think it's a big deal where they have to spend lots of money. Now that we travel farm to farm, they see that they don't need a big group of cows or a nice, fancy barn set up. So more and more are doing it and we've seen more popularity," Tiveron said.

Overall, IVF is gaining a positive reputation as a better option on many operations and the past few years have

William R. "Bill" Swan, 89, Spearfish, SD, longtime Newell, SD area rancher, passed away on March 22, 2016, after a short illness, with his large and loving family at his side.

Bill was born July 12, 1926, at Hugo, CO, to W.H.C. and Elsie (Palmateer) Swan. He grew up on the Swan Ranch and was later joined by his brother, Keith, and sister, Jean. He graduated from high school in 1944 and soon joined the Navy to serve his country. After basic training, he was shipped out

to the Pacific Islands where he served his country honorably.

He began courting the prettiest girl he ever met in high school, and after four years of courtship, which included her awaiting his return from overseas, he married Wilma G. Pisel on October 6, 1946, in Hugo, CO. They made their home on the Swan Ranch south of Hugo until moving to Kansas the fall of 1948, and then DeRidder, LA, to buy sheep after the ranch sold in Colorado. They finally moved to their ranch on Jug Creek east of Newell on May 7, 1954, where they lived until November 2001 when they retired and moved to their home near Spearfish, SD.

Bill and Wilma had a family of six children who were raised on the ranch and learned to ride and work on the ranch and love the prairie. He was an "equal opportunity" man before that became stylish and his daughters worked right along with his sons to help with the ranch work. He always expected them to behave like ladies, even though they might be covered with mud, manure or worse. He was proud of his home grown ranch crew and they learned valuable life lessons through the ranch work.

In the early years in South Dakota, Bill headed up the dipping of the thousands of sheep in the region during the scabies disease outbreak in the early '50s. During the dipping, he became acquainted with his new neighbors and made lifelong friends during that miserable time. He also rode many miles of the fenceless range looking for sheep that strayed due to the unreliability of sheep herders and rustlers. He treasured a good horse that could cover the miles at a fast walk or a lope and always sought out those leggy Thoroughbred types. He was involved in many a horse gather, some of them pretty wild, due to the ranch partnership buying outlaw and feral horses from all over the area. His all-time favorite horse of the 1950's era was a snorty, sorrel gelding named Red that could run the wild ones all day. After Red, and after several hammerheads, he started riding his horse-ofa-lifetime, Reno, a home raised buckskin gelding that many of his friends will re-

Bill and Wilma ran cows, yearling cattle and sheep (when necessary). Bill spent many days and nights at the region's sale barns buying cattle and visiting with his sale buddies. He enjoyed the challenge of buying light and "fixer-upper" calves and making them into fat yearlings on grass. He had an eye for any animal that would make money and was usually right. The bonus of those sale barn times were the great friend-ships that developed and were sustained through the years.

Bill was one of the founders of the Prairie Pals 4-H Club and was the leader of that club for many years. He was heavily involved in the Butte County Fair, was on the county and state fair boards, and enjoyed helping kids excel in 4-H. He also worked hard at putting on 4-H rodeos and was the rodeo announcer at many 4-H and youth rodeos.

He was a leader of the Newell Saddle Club and enjoyed the playdays and events that entailed until his kids were all grown up. Newell Labor Day was another of his favorite things and he did everything from sort bucking stock to flagging until he became the announcer of the rodeo, a job he held and enjoyed for decades. Even after "retiring" from announcing, he attended every Labor Day celebration in Newell.

Though Bill was involved in many activities outside of the ranch, he dedicated himself most intensely to loving Wilma. They were the best of friends and they never ceased to not only love each other, but to be in love with each other. For over 50 years, Bill made the coffee in the morning and took a cup to Wilma in bed after he was done shaving. From there they planned out the day ahead and had some quiet time without interruption. His devotion to her and respect for her never ceased, even after she was gone.

In the 1990s, Bill and Wilma got a small motor home and started traveling. They enjoyed trips all over the country, taking in draft horse sales in Iowa, music shows in Branson, MO, and mule days at both Ralston, WY, and Bishop, CA.
