



ican Hereford Association's annual meeting in Kansas City. I was quite impressed with the meetings, educational sessions and events that the AHA staff conducted. There were two rounds of educational sessions, three choices for each. Most of the sessions were conducted by AHA personnel. diversified farming and cattle operation. Hereford cattle have been bred on their land since the mid-1900s.

The cow herd includes about 300 cows. With the maturity of Conservation Reserve Program acres, the Schultz family is in an expansion phase. Through the use of embryo transfer (ET), approximately 200 of the calves are registered, and the balance will be purebred commercial. The commercial cows have been purebred Hereford since the mid-1940s.

The family has fed out its steers at commercial feedlots for the past 15-20 years. Feedlot performance data, as well as individual carcass data, have been collected and tracked.

In 2008 the family started a spring bull sale. In the sale, all 5-year-old cows that are pregnant with heifer calves sell.

The Schultz family also sells commercial open heifers and customer-owned black baldy heifers each year in the sale. Sandhill genetics have been part of the National Reference Sire Program (NRSP) and the Circle A Ranch heterosis project. Schultz uses these programs to increase the accuracy and predictability of his bulls and to identify outliers that will help move the breed in the desired direction. Sandhill Farms is a Gold TPR Breeder; the family has been whole-herd reporting since the beginning of its registered cattle program.

Schultz was a longtime member of the



also have more than 400 commercial cows and utilize a three-breed cross breeding rotation of Hereford, Angus and Charolais genetics.

Birdwell partners with his father on 300 registered Hereford and Angus cows, which are on the family ranch in Fletcher, OK. They utilize AI and calve both in the spring and the fall. Approximately 100 head of bulls and females are marketed through their production sale hosted in February as well as through private treaty.

Birdwell's focus is to raise bulls and females that excel in the economically important traits — calving ease, marbling, fertility, fleshing ability and rapid growth to a moderate mature size.

Birdwell has also followed in his father's footsteps and has been growing his purebred auction business for the past 10 years.

He is a member of the Oklahoma Hereford Association and has served as a voting delegate for the AHA Annual Meeting. Birdwell is also involved in the Oklahoma Cattlemen's Association as district director and the American Quarter Horse Association and is president of the Kingfisher County Cattlemen's Association.

In his community, Birdwell is a member of the First Baptist Church and is on the grounds and property committee. Birdwell and his wife have three sons, Jarret, 14, Judson, 12 and Jhett, 9.

Tommy Mead



late 1970s, he started Thomas Custom Fitting, in which he fed, fit and showed Hereford cattle across the United States, culminating with winning grand champion horned female at the 1984 National Western Stock Show. As his family began to grow, Thomas dissolved this business to be home with his family.

He then started a 25-year career in the timber and sawmill industry while helping with the day-to-day responsibilities of the ranch. During this time, Thomas had numerous responsibilities including being in charge of ranch sales, managing the operation's human resources and ensuring the safety of 150 employees.

In the 1970s Thomas Herefords began to use AI, but the ranch became aggressive in using this technology in the 1990s when the Thomases also started to utilize expected progeny differences (EPDs).

Today Thomas Herefords maintains 250 head of registered Hereford cows and markets cattle private treaty throughout the United States and other

countries. The ranch sells 75 bulls and more than 50 head of females annually. Its partnership with Accelerated Genetics has provided an opportunity for domestic and international semen sales.

The focus of Thomas Herefords is to develop cattle to meet the needs of commercial customers by producing sound, efficient cattle that can excel in all segments of the beef industry. Thomas is a member of the Montana Hereford Association and has served numerous terms on the board of directors and held various officer positions including treasurer for the 2016 Montana Hereford Association Tour. He has also served as an advisor for the Montana Junior Hereford Association.

Currently, Thomas is vice chairman of the Watershed Restoration Coalition of the Upper Clark Fork River and is on the Powell County Planning Board. He is also a member of the Montana Stockgrowers Association and Clark Fork City Church.

Jimmy Powell

After serving as a lieutenant junior grade in the U.S. Navy, Powell re-

turned to his family ranching operation and began his registered Hereford operation. For more than 50 years, Powell has selected for scale, composition, muscling and milking ability to produce cattle that perform in the feedlot.

Powell graduated with a bachelor's degree from Rice University. He was a member of the advisory committee for the Packers and Stockyards Administration for the United States Department of Agriculture and was named a





Middleswarths Register 101 Years of Ranching, 51 Years at National Western

TORRINGTON, Wyoming — John Middleswarth surely had dreams of a long-lasting family operation when he started ranching near Cheyenne, Wyoming, in 1916, and it is equally certain that he would be awe-struck by the success his descendants have accomplished. An example of that was visible last January when his grandson, Jay Middleswarth, and family held their 58th production sale at the ranch east of Torrington.

Succeeding generations kept moving north, looking for open land that would allow them to spread out and achieve their goals. Leaving the Cheyenne country because his ranch was landlocked, the next stop was near Wheatland, then northeast of Torrington. Finally, Jay's father, Ed, and his uncle, Norm, put down roots on the Wyoming/Nebraska border near Henry, NE, and in the 1950s developed their own new line of cattle, known as Cruzerio.

During the past 100 years, the family has used the 6M brand, a variation on what John had in mind. In the beginning, he wanted to use JM, but couldn't because that brand had been registered by Jim Moore, a cattleman near Jay Em, Wyoming, the small community named for the brand.

John opted for the 6M, that looks like a backward J descending from the left leg of the M. He still got a J and an M.

The family was honored for its 100 years of "Riding for the Brand" at the 2016 National Western Stock Show in Denver. They also were recognized for their 50th year of participating in the event. It was an extremely pleasant occasion for the Middleswarths because in addition to being recognized for their century-old operation, they had the champion winter bull calf pen of

"We're very grateful, and plan to continue as we are in some measure. Without our relationship with the buyers, we wouldn't have been able to reach this level of success," Middleswarth said.



and even the Middleswarth bull sale.

Middleswarth said that the National Western has seen cattle move from the 50s-60s style, to the larger animals of the 80s, and now are backing off to a more moderate size. The volume of animals has decreased, also.

"Texans used to come up and buy a 100 bulls, but now a lot of people do their own production sales. There used to be more range cattle there, too, but now there are a lot of show types.

"The Stock Show still serves its purpose, though," he added. "I look at it as a window for owners to show their livestock.

"As a young man, we looked more at blood lines and types, and it was more of a marketing tool, but I've looked at it more as a way to educate myself in what the trends are."

According to Middleswarth, one of the trends is bulls that are heavier than those of 40-50 years ago, and his own Herefords grow faster.

"About six-seven years ago, during the drought, I experimented with genetics, and we now have quicker growth than we did in 1970."

The family's bull sale has changed with the times, as well, with buyers moving from pen to pen, instead of moving the animals.

"I got the idea at a farm sale," Middleswarth explained Wednesday. "I was watching the Madden brothers moving their pickup from place to place, sell-





ing the equipment, and thought, 'Why wouldn't that work for our bull sale?"

Four years ago, he switched and is very pleased with the results.

"What lead to it was the lack of labor, and time," Middleswarth explained. "We have the bulls sorted in groups into pens, and the auctioneers drive the pickup to each one. The bulls are happier because their buddies are behind them in the pen, and they don't spook as much when they don't have to move around one at a time. This is more natural for them, and it gives the buyers a chance to compare the bulls in the pen.



The Douthit families of St. Francis, KS, represented by Douthit Herefords and 4V Ranch Douthit Herefords, will be recognized in January as the 2017 Friend of the National Western by the Red Meat Club of Denver. A perennial fixture as Yards exhibitors, 2017 will mark the families' 74th year exhibiting purebred Hereford cattle at the National Western.

Frank and Mary Douthit settled in northwest Kansas in the 1930s, and shortly thereafter sons Jim and Thad bought the family's first Hereford bull. After Thad turned to commercial operations in the 1970s, the Douthit Herefords tradition continued under brother Jim and his three sons, Walter, Roger, and Steve, who took over as partners in 1984. Primarily for estate planning purposes, in 2008 the brothers dissolved their partnership. While Roger turned to running commercial cattle after that, Walter and Steve continued the seedstock operation as Douthit Herefords and 4V Ranch Douthit Herefords, respectively.

The brothers at the time divided the Douthit cowherd on a lottery basis. Although that common genetic foundation still yields a lot of similarities between the two operations, some variation in type and design has inevitably emerged as each operation independently makes selection and breeding decisions based on personal preferences and customer demands.

Despite that variation, certain themes continue that have placed the Douthits at the forefront of the Hereford breed for roughly 80 years. For the cattle, structure, disposition, calving ease and feed efficiency are paramount traits. And for the families themselves, honesty, integrity, and consistency are the guiding principles. It's a combination that has won the Douthit family the respect of their peers, as evidenced by the induction of Walter, Roger, and Steve into the American Hereford Association Hall of Fame in 2012.

Today, the fourth generation of the family is actively managing both operations. Roger passed in 2013, and Steve was lost in a tragic farming accident in the fall of 2015. 4V Ranch is guided today by the family of Steve and his wife Melva, including their children Ana, Erica, Margo, Courtney and Thomas, their sons-in-law Tyler Enfield and Matt Gattshall and their grandsons Zarik and Quade. Walter, his daughter Megan and her husband Chuck Downey direct operations at Douthit Herefords.

The Douthit's will be honored at the Red Meat Club dinner on Thursday, January 12, 2017, held in the National Western Club. This year's featured speaker is meat industry leader and NWSS executive board member Mark Gustafson. Drawing on more than 38 years' experience in promoting and advancing U.S. red meat exports, Mark will speak on "International Markets: Past, Present & Future." clear that it was going to take a massive effort to put it out.


Shortly before, 911 had been called. Started right along I-90. Latest reports are they will never know the cause but they do know it was man-made. A passing fire fighter from another area made the call. At that time it was the size of a pickup box but he was without anything of use to put it out. Valiant try but it got over the fence. Philip Volunteer Fire rolled out at 1:15 pm. By then it was gaining a head of steam and was rollin' through a pasture that was only grazed in the winter so fuel was plenty and the wind...well it was 30 miles travel for the firefighters.

To keep the timeline straight I probably saw the smoke about the time the firefighters got to the scene. Everyone who is out here has a pickup mounted firefighting unit/weed sprayer, but nearly all had been drained and winterized. The direction of the fire was going to lead it into a very large field of wheat that had been combined months before, a massive fuel source.

With nowhere near enough manpower but a grim determination the few firefighters that were able to get there quickly enough fought with everything they had to keep it out of the combined field. Alas, their best efforts could not, and then they fought for their lives to outrun the fire in their trucks. One thousand acres burned in 3 minutes. In 10 minutes the fire was 3 miles from

where they desperately fought to keep it manageable.

What was next was pure chaos. Not once in my life have I thought that this could happen with the equipment we have today. Fences were cut, cattle shoved out of what we thought "in the way" was. Just as soon as we thought we knew what the direction was, the wind hit the back of my neck just as hard as earlier. My only thought was run!!!!!!!! Not for me but the families that lived in the new direction.

Helpless is a feeling that most have had. I thought I knew the feeling, could understand it.

Standing on a hill southeast of Cottonwood I realized that I had never felt it before. The fire that had charred a path 10 miles long in 2 hours was now 10 miles wide with the wind howling. At least 6 ranch headquarters directly in its path.

Dust is still rolling, not just behind pickup trucks but behind fire departments arriving from every corner of the western half of the State. Nearly 300 firefighters, almost all volunteers, from 40 different departments spanning 10 counties. Add on what had to be 500 other helpers.

As brutal as Mother Nature can be, change always comes. With the sinking of the sun the winds slowed and the manpower was able to get the upper hand. The terrain was level enough to fight it effectively. Eventually it was unable to consume more and had to be satisfied with burning what it had already started.

The heroics of that day were more than can count. Firetrucks smashing through fences just yards in front of flames to save cattle. A young girl who had never drove before helping get vehicles to safety. Everyone gave something. Some young or old could only pray while some gave their eyebrows. Yet in an incredible miracle of everyone working together and keeping their cool each of the primary residences were saved. Almost more amazing was there were no major human injuries. But 41,360 acres lay charred in the wake. Thousands of bales up in flames along with most winter grass, somewhere over 200 miles of fence, barns and other outbuildings along with what stands right now at 284 head of cattle. All of us on the drive home thought there had to be some way we could have done more! And now, after all is burned, crawl in a hole and wish it had never happened. The possibility of any of us making one iota of difference in the cleanup/get back to whatever the new normal is going to be seemed further away than the moon. There needs

to be a term over shell-shocked to describe what happened in 7 hours of Hell on Earth. That is right, depending on who you believe on when the fire line was contained it burned from 120-135 acres a MINUTE from pickup box size till contained!

To paraphrase the song "through the dust and smoke of this man made hell walked a man with a giant idea that nobody knew well." Still reeling from this I got call from Bob Stanfiel. He is a competition BBQ cook that I had met on 4 occasions. I get to the house at 12:30 a few days after the fire and he has left a message on my phone. "Don't know what I can do to help but I can cook." On that day Bob could have walked the streets of Philip unknown. He had catered an event for me but not 15 people in the town would have known they recognized him. Bob called a few of his competition BBQ buddies to hold a fund raiser for fire relief. Free food donated from out of the area cooked to perfection with a free will offering. Philip, SD is a town of 800 people. A sports team is playing out of town, some have to work, hunting season is upon us so everyone with an guest is gone. They pull in to town with 1000 pounds of BBQ meat and start cooking.

Mother Nature gave us a perfect day. As if the firefighters had not done enough they pulled their trucks out of the shop, scrubbed the floor and set up tables. A couple guys drive close to 100 miles to pick on their guitars and sing.

There is NO WAY a town like this can eat 1000 pounds of meat even counting outsiders with all this going on. Eleven a.m. was the advertised start time. By 11:05 there was a line. At a rate of 300+ people an hour going through, the line at 12:30 it was a full block long. About 2 p.m. that line got to where the wait was only a few minutes.

\$42,000.....that would be no problem anywhere, right? Free will donation?

Six competition BBQ cooks prepared the food for everybody that came. One thousand plus people were served. I tried to catch the guys who were affected and make sure they didn't pay. One of them replied "others got it worse than I did" while he dropped \$100 in the bucket. An old guy who walks with a cane came. I told him I would get him a sandwich. While I was getting it he handed \$100 to the guy with him and left. Couldn't hear or walk but wanted to help. A cattle buyer from Missouri showed up at 5 p.m. Sorry, the food is gone. He made a donation anyway.

I am sure that wherever a person goes it would be the same level of care for their fellow man, right? It would be no problem anywhere to get 800 men to stand shoulder to shoulder to protect someone else's property, right. Should be easier in the city, right? Since the fire there has been many tons of hay donated and days of labor donated to get fence back up to contain the cows





through the winter.

And then the fund raiser. Bob had never met a single person affected by the fire when he called me. One of the first guys in line had driven 100 miles to come. He wasn't the farthest away when it was over. And the best thing to happen was the handshakes and conversation going on. "Haven't seen you in a while" was probably the most used phrase of the day as the community got even closer knit, not just the community of Philip but the community of agriculture over a large area. Friendships were re-enforced and friendships made and the ties that bind gladly accepted another knot.

There is a part of the human condition that only survives by giving. It does not live on a large paycheck nor by locking your door and watching TV. You cannot keep it going by not knowing your neighbors or by being suspicious of what somebody else wants of you and always making sure you come out on top. No, if you want it to survive you have to feed it. Know your neighbors, care about their well-being and volunteer for something. It is commonly known as compassion and it's side effect is satisfaction. It seems to flourish in rural America but seems to be endangered in the cities.

I may drive through a city but the only way I will stay there is if you drag my dead body there and dig a deep hole. Maybe you should put a large rock on top if you want to keep me there.


