## Thorstenson Herefords True to Century-Long, Deep Roots With Hereford Cattle

The Thorstenson family has stayed true to their deep roots in farming and ranching through over a century in South Dakota. Bill Thorstenson's greatgrandfather was one of the first settlers in Walworth County, Dakota Territory. Bill's decision to return to the family operation after college prompted the beginning of the registered Hereford breeding program. The family had traditionally run Hereford cattle so they were a natural choice.

Rasmus Thorstenson and his brother John left Norway in 1885. They arrived by ship at Portland, Maine, and took the train to Canton, then Dakota Territory.


They had a brother, Peter, already living in Canton and they had to find him; they couldn't speak any English, so when they asked somebody they would just shake their head. They finally found a Swede that understood a little bit of Norwegian.

The Thorstenson surname was born when John, Peter and Rasmus came to the United States.

"Their father's name was Torsten, they just added the 'son' and the name became Thorstenson," Bill said.

Peter and Rasmus spent a year working for the railroad and got some money put together to buy supplies. They could have bought land in the Canton area cheap, at \$6/acre, but they didn't have the money, so they came to Walworth County to homestead. The brothers traveled by rail to Ipswich, where the rails ended, with a couple of yokes of oxen, a very small herd of cattle, some equipment and some potatoes to plant. From Ipswich, they made their way a little further west, where both homesteaded in Walworth County.

"By 1888 they had a couple of quarters

lined up," Bill said. "One is where our place is. Rasmus built a sod house, and lived in a dugout while building it. He just dug a hole in the ground. I have a picture of the sod house, it's unbelievable how you could live in something like that."

Rasmus brought his bride, Severina, home to the sod house in the new state

of South Dakota in 1890.

"They had four children and lived in the sod house till 1906, when they built a big two story house.

Herman Thorstenson, Bill's grandfather, took over the farm from Rasmus, raising a family in the same house with his wife Gina (Opheim). Herman died of a cerebral hemorrhage in 1939 at 49 years old. Ralph, Bill's father, was only 14 when his father passed away.

"The operation just stumbled along till my father was a junior in high school and decided to take over," Bill said. "He, along with myself, developed the farm and ranch into what it is today."

Ralph ran Hereford cattle, taking over the farm after his father Herman died



unexpectedly.

"Dad ran all Hereford cattle. In 1944 he started pasturing them out West River on the reservation northeast of Wakpala. He had deeded land plus lease land. They trailed the cattle out in the spring with small calves and trailed them home in the fall. I got in on the trail rides when I was about 12 or 13 years old."

The family trailed the cattle across the old bridge that crossed the Missouri River southwest of Mobridge and across the Grand River on the "singing bridge." There was a big draw between the two bridges where they would camp with the cattle and spend the night. It usually took three days to cover the distance of over 30 miles. Their trail drive days came to a close after 1964 when the Oahe Dam was completed and Lake Oahe filled.

Bill graduated from SDSU in 1974 with a degree in chemistry and zoology. About this time, Ralph was starting to feel the load of the farm and livestock.

"Dad decided either somebody was going to have to come back and help or he would have to sell down," Bill said. "That's when I decided to come back, and my dad and I decided to go into the registered cattle business. In 1975, he started buying registered females and built the herd up."

Thorstenson Herefords' first sale was held in 1977; this year will be their 48th sale.

"We started pretty small and it was tough to get going but we managed," Bill said. "We really didn't look at other breeds. We had always had commercial Hereford cattle; that was the breed we preferred."

Bill and Paula Thorstenson married in 1971. Their three children, Beth, Darin and Tate grew up on the family farm and ranch operation. Beth and her husband, Rich Fiedler, live in the Selby area, where Rich operated Marin Biel Insurance along with their son Brady. Beth works as a nurse in the Mobridge Hospital clinic. Their son Colin is farming in the area, and their daughter Rachel is studying pharmacy at South Dakota State University.

Brady and his wife Hannah just had their first child.

"I didn't know either one of my grandpas," Bill said, "Yet here we are.

We have a great-grandson, now; Baker William."

Darin came back to the ranch in 2006 after working in construction for ten years, and is now a partner in the operation and working towards taking over the ranch. He and his wife Danielle live in the house Rasmus built in 1906: the

fifth and sixth generations of the family to call it home.

"Darin and Danielle have three girls; they all ride and they are a big help," Bill said. "Their oldest, Gracen, is a freshman in high school; Landri is a sixth grader and Haven is a third grader."

Tate works for First Bank

and Trust in Brookings and Sioux Falls as an ag and commercial loan officer. He and his wife Michaela live in Tea, South Dakota, with their three children: Miah, Micah and Noah.

"He comes back and helps whenever we have big projects or are working cattle," Bill said.

Thorstensons have also built up a registered Angus herd, and sell about half Angus and half Hereford yearling bulls each spring.

"We have the sale on the ranch," Bill said. "My father had the facility built. Pretty much the whole family is there to help when we have our sale."

Thorstensons AI'd for some years, but decided to just breed naturally to keep things less labor intensive. They are able to run multiple bulls and then DNA test the calves to determine the sire.

"We calve in March, and are usually done by mid-April," Bill said. "We always have a group of 80-100 first calf heifers to take our replacements from. We have a rigid culling program. We strive for strong maternal traits, good udders, high fertility, good footed cattle that are structurally sound and have a good disposition. Our primary goal is to produce a big, healthy calf."

Thorstenson Herefords catch the attention of people traveling highway



83 through the area, a unique sight in a day when black hides have become the norm.

"Presently, all our pasture is down in the Lowry hills, south of the home place," Bill said. "We have farmland and some pasture around the home place."

The family has endured many ups and downs since Rasmus Thorstenson decided to make Walworth County his home. He chose well; fertile soil, picturesque hills and generally good growing conditions support cattle and crops. But droughts and blizzards are common battles on the ranch.

"The winter of 1996-97 was the

"I've always believed in buying good bulls," Bill said. "The success I had with that breeding bull has been nationwide."

A son of 25L, THR Thor 4029 took the program even further.

"My brother Roger bought him in the sale, and I always wintered his bulls for him. When he came back after his first breeding season, I couldn't believe how that bull had developed. I told Roger, 'I'll buy that bull back and give you credit on another bull."

Bill sold an interest in the 4029 bull to Mark and Nate Frederickson and another part ownership to ABS, and is still seeing his offspring doing well in

sales and shows, even though the bull was born in 2004.

Bill enjoys watching the genetics at work in the cattle herd, and the relationships the family has built with customers over the years. Delivering bulls and heifers has given the opportunity to see the good results their genetics add to their customers' cattle. Most bulls go

worst winter we've ever endured on the ranch," Bill said.

Thousands of cattle in South Dakota died over the course of the winter, due to record low temperatures and record high snowfall. In early April of 1997, after snow had melted and it appeared spring had come, yet another blizzard hit and claimed an estimated 100,000 head of cattle.

"We lost about 25 calves in that storm, but had a bull calf that survived it that was our highest selling bull we've ever sold. In 1998 that bull went to Randy Owens in Alabama."

Randy showed him, and the bull generated a lot of interest for his high growth rate and as grand champion at the American Royal in Kansas City.

"That was an exciting time in our history with our Hereford cattle," Bill said.

About 25 years ago, Bill shifted the herd from horned to polled cattle.


forward to building connections with and serving commercial producers and breeders alike."

### **Bovine Congestive Heart Failure Impacts on the Beef Industry: University of Wyoming Research Team at Work**

University of Wyoming researchers Dr. Hannah Cunningham-Hollinger, Dr. Cody Gifford, and Ph.D. student Chase Markel are utilizing Pulmonary Arterial Pressure (PAP) measurements on cattle at the Laramie Research Extension Center, with a predominant focus on Bovine Congestive Heart Failure (BCHF) and its impact on the beef feedlot industry.

A UW Assistant Professor of Animal Genetics, Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger's research includes nutrition, reproduction, and genetics.

Dr. Gifford is a meat scientist with a research focus in meat quality.

Markel completed his undergraduate and master's degrees with Dr. Gifford and Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger. Now a Ph.D. student at the University of Wyoming, he is continuing his research focus on predicting and understanding the impact of risk of BCHF. All three are Wyoming natives.

Dr. Tim Holt, a professor in the Veterinary Teaching Hospital at Colorado State University, frequently works with the team, and trained Markel to do PAP testing.

"Tim is integral to all of us," Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger said. "He's brilliant."

While Holt's lifetime of research has focused on "Brisket Disease" or High Altitude Disease, the University of Wyoming team is honing in on BCHF.

"Our research focuses more on the feedlot side of things," Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger said. "Dr. Gifford conducts meat quality research; I do research on feed efficiency and the microbiome"

Economic losses due to deaths and reduced efficiency of cattle on feed due to BCHF have pushed the team to do more research on the condition.

"Our data are hinting towards downstream effects on meat quality from BCHF, but these are preliminary data at this point," Dr. Gifford said.

The most recent published work from other animal scientists indicates that BCHF may be responsible for up to seven percent of total death loss in feedlots, but the UW research team said considering sub-clinical animals that have not died during the feedlot phase is important. "Only death loss is taken into consideration in that figure," Markel said. "There are a lot of negative consequences to beef production in subclinical cases. An animal may not actually die of BCHF, but can be affected in the supply chain. BCHF impacts everything: growth performance, carcass quality, even sensory attributes of individual muscles. From an economic impact standpoint, this is significant. We're trying to pick apart what all the specific consequences of BCHF are."

The location of the University of

Wyoming in Laramie has the built-in advantage of high elevation, Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger said. The team is keenly aware of the connections and similarities between HAD and BCHF.

"Maybe there are not a lot of people feeding cattle out at our elevation, but having elevation is a challenge that is helpful in this type of research."

"There is debate as to whether or not BCHF and HAD are the same thing," Markel said. "It may not be exactly the same, but in terms of how we interpret disease and its process, the end result is the same."

An animal incurs some type of challenge to its respiratory system, which can include high elevation, sickness, or other factors. This in turn has an effect on the pulmonary vascular system, eventually leading to thickening of the hypertension progresses. heart wall as the stage of pulmonary



"Pulmonary arterial pressure testing is a good measure to predict the impact on an animal's pulmonary vascular system, but the test doesn't tell us how the disease started or how it ends," Markel said. "In a large scope, HAD and BCHF are the same, just caused by different challenges to that animal. Different factors are involved that we don't yet understand.

"As we follow some of these feedlot cattle through the processing plant, some are getting into advanced stages of heart failure, and some have pretty rough livers too," Dr. Gifford said. "We find it interesting that we don't see this in every single one, but some seem to have some other metabolic challenges going on. We don't know if there is a connection between liver abscesses and heart scores in cattle."

Respiratory disease is a challenge that has caused concern in feedlot cattle for a long time, Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger said.

"One thing we're looking at is whether pathogens are present on nasal swabs from these steers, to get an idea if a respiratory insult might be accompanying steers with a higher PAP test or enlarged hearts," she said.

The team is now working with cattle outside of the UW herd as part of current research.

"Previously everything in our research studies were completed on the University's herd," Dr. Cunningham-



Hollinger said. "Because at this elevation, we have selected bulls for lower PAP tests and over time our cows have been selectively bred for resistance to HAD."

There is still some randomness to PAP test results even in herds that have been selected for low PAP scores, Markel said.

"We always start our program with an initial PAP test," he said. "We found out quickly that we will see every possible score; you can select for decades and a high PAP is still going to happen."

PAP scores can range from the low 30s to 150+, in which the lower values would indicate low risk and higher values would indicate extremely high risk.

"This is the really tricky part of this disease," Markel said. "A PAP test is the best indicator we have of whether

or not an animal might get HAD or BCHF, but sire heritability accounts for about 30% of PAP score variability in the scientific literature."

"PAP testing is an important piece of our BCHF research, but we believe other factors are involved when some individual animal PAP scores change later in the feedlot feeding phase," Dr. Gifford said.

During Markel's graduate work, there was some relationship between PAP levels and performance of feedlot steers towards the end of the feedlot phase.

"One group of steers almost ended up self-sorting," Dr. Gifford said. "If you compare the PAP levels toward the end of the feedlot phase with their performance, feed efficiency, etc., the group with highest PAP levels grew the slowest. Another group with less extreme PAP scores performed much better," he said.

The estimate of heritability on the maternal side has not been robustly studied to the team's knowledge.

"It would be hard to study from the perspective of sample size," Markel said. "Roughly 30% of PAP variation is inherited from the sire, but we don't know how much variability is introduced by maternal heritability and environment. That's a harder one to study."

More people are starting to PAP test their heifers, Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger said, so it might become easier.

"Maybe in time we'll be able to build that data. We have talked about trying to implement some more on the maternal side, tracking that cow, what environments she was exposed to, her health over her life cycle, but it's a lot more difficult to tease that out."

While the UW cattle have mostly been crossbred cattle, over the last three years they are starting to move towards the development of two purebred herds: Hereford and Red Angus, Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger said. In the long term, this should benefit their research on BCHF.

"The differences between Hereford and Red Angus in regard to PAP scores is another benefit we'll have built in," she said.

Dr. Gifford described two different directions they have followed with

"We followed some of the UW cattle through a feedlot system, and now are also tracking cattle that are in an external non-UW affiliated feedlot trying to get a different representation. The ones we've followed through that are from the UW herd and include both steers and heifers, both weaned calves and calves that had some backgrounding prior to coming to the feedlot. In two of the four studies, we have manipulated their diet to some degree, trying to better understand how intake may impact PAP and the ultimate progression of risk for this pathology."

When cattle come in, they follow them on feed for 120-200+ days, tracking weights, feed efficiency, feed intake, whether any need to be treated for respiratory symptoms, then follow them through a commercial plant to assess hearts and lungs.

"We're trying to gather as much information as we can," Dr. Gifford said. "We score the hearts on those cattle to try to understand how much progression of BCHF is taking place. We also collect tissue from hearts and lungs to observe structural and tissue changes on a cellular level."

A strip loin sample is also collected to measure marbling, fat content, color changes, tenderness, and sensory aspects in relation to each animal's PAP score.

"We are starting to see some prelimi-

nary sensory attribute and meat color changes," Dr. Gifford said.

The team is also collecting blood samples, nasal swabs, and doing microbiome analysis on these animals, particularly at the microbiome present in the upper respiratory tract.

"We've found that respiratory disease might be a factor in BCHF," Markel said. "Going forward, we hope we will uncover more details. It does appear the microbiome of the upper respiratory tract is an important factor."

Markel conducts PAP tests on cattle throughout the feeding period.

"We test prior to the study, and every 60-75 days while they are in the feed-lot," he said. "This gives our group a unique perspective compared to some previous work."

PAP testing enables the team to track the development of progressive heart failure in animals in the feedlot over time.

"We see some animals at low risk that go up to high risk," Dr. Gifford said.

Another question the team plans to dig into is the connection between gut health and BCHF. They plan to look at rumen fluid along with their other data.

"We have samples in our freezers that we haven't analyzed yet," Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger said. "We have so many ideas from a physiological standpoint that we'd like to investigate. We'd like to look at inflammatory markers and gene expression, which may be connected to meat quality.

"Decreased performance, and probably an underestimate of economic loss associated with this is becoming more and more concerning. We would like to improve on increasing the number of cattle we study. That's why we're expanding our work to other feedlots."

The team is trying to look at what cattle producers can do to mitigate BCHF and improve the odds of health for their animals.

"One of our goals as we study the physiology of BCHF is to also look at management practices that might influence those things," Dr. Cunningham-Hollinger said.

While the team said they don't plan on telling cattlemen to change their feeding practices, they do believe that if meat quality issues and loss of performance are determined from this research, this will be important information for the

industry.



# Legislation to reshape SD Brand Board clears House with veto-proof majority

PIERRE, S.D. — The latest attempt to steer control of a crucial commission away from the governor's office is on its way to the State Senate for further consideration.

The South Dakota State House gave a strong endorsement to House Bill 1266, which would move the state's Brand Board out from under the South Dakota Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources (DANR) and under the South Dakota Office of School and Public Lands (S&PL).

A bevy of lawmakers past and current have made a run at like reforms over the years, responsive to concerns from South Dakota ranchers that the board — responsible for registering and regulating livestock brands, and ensuring new brands do not conflict with existing registered brands in the state — has not been actively fulfilling its obligations.

During the measure's first committee hearing in the House's Agriculture and Natural Resources committee, ranchers from across the state holding brands approved by the Brand Board laid into it about delays in service, cattle rustling complaints going unanswered and unsolved, and the pace at which members had been appointed to the four-member board.

"Producers are growing increasingly frustrated with the Brand Board under DANR," said freshman Rep. Jana Hunt, the bill's prime sponsor. "Fees have been increasing, and stock barns and producers want to know why."

Hunt pointed out too, that the office hasn't been audited since 2008. Moving it under S&PL Commissioner Brock Greenfield could open the door to that.

"Producers deserve to know how their money is being spent," Hunt continued.

Opposition to the measure focused on the new governor's commitment to finding solutions. A policy advisor with the governor's office assured committee members during HB 1266's committee hearing that Gov. Larry Rhoden, a brand

holder himself, was focused on patching up problems. The legislation could create bureaucratic hang-ups too, noted the governor's office, if the governor were to maintain appointment authority while another statewide elected office handled operations.

"Give the governor, a rancher, time to sort this out," said Rep. Tim Goodwin. "He's only been on the job two weeks. He can figure this out. He's a West River guy."

But patience, particularly amongst policymakers representing largely agricultural communities, has run thin. Rep. Liz May of Kyle — a longtime proponent of sweeping changes to the Brand Board — pointed out that Rhoden has been a member of the executive branch since 2019, and the problems faced by ranchers have only continued to get worse.


"Right now, voices are not being heard," said May, noting that instances of cattle theft have continued to rise. "He has been in this fight as long as I have, and he has had opportunities to do something different and he has not... We are trying to look for the largest part of our agricultural industry, the number one industry in the state."

The House's Native American lawmakers too said that inefficiencies had particularly harmed their constituents.

"Producers, time and time again, have come to the Legislature wanting change, and it hasn't happened," said Democrat Eric Emery. "I think the time has come that it is beyond the governor's control, we need to listen to our cattle producers and advocate for their needs."

Lawmakers voted 47-22 to advance the bill to the State Senate. That gives them just enough to uphold the measure, should Rhoden have the opportunity to veto it.

Reform to the DANR based commission has long been a goal of various law-makers. Just last year, a measure failed in the Senate that would have required Brand Board members to be elected by brand holders, instead of appointed by the governor.





Eleanor (Boe) Ingalls, 94, of Maurine, SD, stepped into glory on Tuesday, Feb. 4, 2025 at Aspen Grove Assisted

Living in Sturgis, SD.

Eleanor La Vonne Boe was born Sept. 18, 1930, in a farmhouse near Vale, SD.

She was the fourth of 10 children born to Rudolph and Opal Boe.

She grew up on the farm with her parents, her grandparents and many brothers. As the only girl in the family at that time, Eleanor enjoyed special treatment from her Norwegian grandparents who lived in an adjoining part of the house.

When she was 8 years old, two important events happened. She finally got a sister to add to her 5 brothers, and the family moved to a ranch near Colony, Wyoming. In addition to doing lots of chores, Eleanor recalled many days spent playing in the Wyoming hills, returning home when her mother rang a bell on a post in the yard.

About 1942, the family moved back to the farm near Vale. Three years later when she was in high school, her father bought a grocery store in Vale, and the family moved to town. Along the way, three more brothers were added to the family.

Eleanor attended high school in Newell and Vale. Among other activities, she was on the basketball team and played coronet in the band. Because her mother was not always well, Eleanor regularly fixed meals for their family of nearly a dozen people. During her senior year, Eleanor and her brother Bryce took turns taking days off from school to run the grocery store and the boardinghouse above the store. In this situation and so many others throughout her life, she proved herself to be willing to do whatever job needed to be done.

After graduating from Vale High School in 1948, Eleanor attended an accelerated teacher-training program at Spearfish Normal School. She began her first year of teaching a few weeks before she turned 18.

During the fall of her second year of teaching, she met Hugh Ingalls at a community dance in Vale. Eleanor recalled saying to a friend, "Who's that good looking guy? He must be from California." Hugh's dashing good looks and his kindness quickly won her over, and the two began dating. Her students used to tease her when her cowboy pilot buzzed over their school in his little red and white airplane.

Eleanor and Hugh were married at the First Lutheran Church in Newell on June 1, 1950. After a honeymoon trip to Yellowstone National Park, the couple moved into a small house along Horse Creek, just below Horse Butte in northwest Meade County. Children soon followed, starting with Marie then Peggy, Dan, Kenny, Beth and Laila.

While the family was growing up, Eleanor sewed her own clothes as well as most of her children's. She raised a large garden and did lots of canning. She was a master at stretching a dollar, which was especially important during the lean early years. She taught her children how to cook and sew and made sure they had access to piano lessons, even if it meant driving them the 75-mile round trip to Faith.

Eleanor was an active partner in the ranch operations. She ran the windrower and moved cattle. She paid bills, kept the books, and assisted Hugh any way she could as they acquired land and grew their Black Angus herd. Eleanor put a lot of food across the table, feeding hungry ranch hands, neighbors and relatives who would squeeze around the expanded table in her tiny kitchen.

Eleanor was also involved in her church and the community. For many years she taught Sunday School and could be counted on to help with whatever project the church had going. She especially enjoyed several years of leading after-school Bible clubs in area schools. She loved teaching, and one year in the mid-60s she even dusted off her teaching certificate when she was asked to step in after a teacher left partway through the year. She went back to college that summer and taught another full year.

Eleanor loved to tell stories (she was a Boe, after all!), and she loved to laugh. She sometimes couldn't contain her laughter, especially after successfully bluffing in a card game.

She cherished spending time with her children, grandchildren and greatgrandchildren, her siblings and her friends. Most of all, she loved Hugh. She supported and stood by him through good and challenging times, during periods of timely rains as well as droughts and blizzards. She enjoyed being with him and sharing their lives together. They would have celebrated their 75th anniversary this coming June.

When she was diagnosed with a heart condition in December, Eleanor remained positive. "I've lived a great life," she said. And as she looked toward her future, she told those around her, "It's gonna be okay. And even it's not okay... it's still okay." Her faith in God was very strong, and she was not afraid. Eleanor died peacefully in her sleep while holding Hugh's hand.



### William "Billy" Evenson

William "Billy" Evenson, 90, lifelong Hettinger, ND area Angus Cattleman passed away at the West River Re-

gional Medical Center with his wife, Eleanora and his three daughters his side on January 29, 2025.

Billy Evenson coming to a close the prairies of the Western Dakotas were growing with young families and their dreams of the future. Many had already spent nearly three decades laying the foundation of deep family values and traditions that the state would soon be known for.

Farming with his father Will, Ernest and his wife Lillian (Erickson) Evenson were one of these young couples. On December 17, 1934, in the Springer Hospital William "Billy" Evenson was born. Weighing in at just over five pounds, pro basketball was probably a long shot. With strong Norwegian ancestral roots and Adams County being land locked the future for Billy pointed toward farming and ranching.

Billy is the eldest of five children who helped on the farm while growing up near Hettinger, ND. He attended Hettinger schools where he became active in sports. He was captain on what was said to be a pretty salty Hettinger Shooting Stars basketball team. At one point in his hard-court career, he played center apparently depending more on position and his skills rather than his towering dominating size.

He would also play football. Eleanora, said he was always introduced by his pastor as Hettinger's quarter back. This statement perplexes some of his family because we always thought he was a half back, which he was. Bill explained that she really didn't know the difference

Sports continued to be a large part of Billy's life even after graduation in 1953. He continued to play basketball on an independent team for a few years and added softball to his skills where his pitching haunted batters until his 60th birthday. Bill showed no mercy in his pitching, even striking out his son-in-law Dan. He loved to talk to those who would listen as he stood a bit taller, smiled a bit broader, puffed out his chest a bit more, and his eyes would sparkle with love and pride as he talked about the accomplishments of his grandkids.

Over the years Bill would wear many hats other than his farming/ranching one. In 1957 he would join the National Guard where he would become First Sergeant and be one of the top five recruiters for North Dakota, winning a trip to Washington DC. A memorable trip that he says was well worth it.

From 1973 to 1997 he served on the Board of the Hettinger Equity Exchange, 10 years as President. His interest in youth and schools got him elected to the School Board from 1974 to 1980 where he would also take a term as President.

A lifelong member of Hettinger Lutheran Church, a regular usher during his youth, and later served as a Church Trustee and President of the Council.

His love of the farm started early, from tractors with open wheels and putt-putt engines to bidirectional with air-conditioned cabs. From dairy herd to Black Angus herd, delivering milk to town by horse and wagon to tracking his production number on computers, Bill has truly seen times change. His father had purchased the farm in 1946, and Bill stayed on after graduation to work full time with his dad. In 1952 the purchase of 12 registered Black Angus cows was the beginning of the future. They participated in Winter Shows in Rapid City and local Fairs and have placed first many times. In 1976 broth-






