Fall is coming fast here in northwest South Dakota. We were blessed with abundant rain this summer but now it's starting to dry out and the leaves

are turning color quickly. With fall in this area comes a raft of Hereford female sales plus a few Hereford tours.

Since we are printing this issue only a few days after some of these events, full coverage will spill over into the next issue.

There have been some strong Hereford female sales in the last month which have commanded excellent prices.

The biggest sales event for September undoubtedly was the Churchill Cattle Co. complete herd dispersal in Manhattan, MT. To say it was a phenomenal sale might be an understatement. The big twoday event kept bidders on their toes as Auctioneer Joe Goggins blazed through 425 Hereford lots to average \$24,504 for a gross of \$10,414,200. This is by far the biggest and most successful sale I've been to in my life and it was an experience I will never forget.

Congratulations to Dale and Nancy Venhuizen, their family and their diligent, hard-working crew on a superb job of putting on such an incredible offering.

Dale and Nancy's commitment to the Hereford breed has been incredible and it has not only paid off for them but for breeders who have benefitted from their breeding program.

Elshere Combines Rodeo With Herefords

While PRCA bronc rider Cole Elshere has earned accolades in the arena, it's the family ranch in South Dakota that truly defines his passion and purpose.

His family's history in the South Dakota plains traces back to 1895, when his great-great-grandfather homesteaded in the Milesville, SD, area under the Homestead Act. However, the Elshere family had been ranching even prior to President Abraham Lincoln's signature on the settlement legislation.

While most of the family stayed in Milesville, Cole's father, Andy, forged his own path near Faith, SD, where Cole grew up. Elshere Herefords was established in 2012, and today, Cole and Andy manage the ranch together with their families, while Cole continues to compete on the rodeo circuit. Now a four-time qualifier to the National Finals Rodeo, Cole balances his demanding rodeo schedule with ranch responsibilities.

Riding through college

Cole earned a full-ride scholarship to attend Gillette College in Gillette, WY, as a member of the rodeo team. But his time in the arena began way before col-

"I started going to 4-H rodeos when

I was 8," Cole recalled. "I watched my cousins Ryan and J.J. ride broncs when I was little and just wanted to follow their lead." He competed in all the events, but bronc riding was always where his heart was. By the time he entered high school, bronc riding had become his clear focus, carrying him through college.

"I was on a horse all the time as a kid," Cole said. "So I understand horses and the nature of them. I understand

what a young horse is thinking, so it helps me if I draw a younger horse at a rodeo."

Although initially majoring architectural in engineering Gillette College, Cole quickly realized his heart was in ranching and changed his degree to business.

He set his sights on finding his way back into the cattle business while still excelling in the arena. With Gillette only a 3.5-hour drive away from home, Cole was able to go back any weekend he wasn't competing to help with the ranch.

"Rodeo has its ups and downs, but I've always been able to come home on my days off and get something accomplished, whether it was building fence or doing something else on the ranch," he said.

Cole planned his first major investment in the business: 20 bred heifers he planned to come home and help calve out. But shortly after making the purchase, an injury landed him in surgery, forcing him to sit out the calving season and leaving Andy to handle the calving on his own. It wasn't the season Cole envisioned, but it further deepened his appreciation for his dad's help and dedication as a ranching partner.

"I'm just so proud of him," Cole said, "as hard as he works, and always trying to think outside the box and not being afraid to change something."

He added, "My dad always says, 'We're never stuck in the rut because we're always hitting them sideways.' We definitely make mistakes on the ranch, but we're always trying to move forward and make things better.'

While still keeping the family ranch a priority, Cole's college rodeo career took him all the way to the College



National Finals Rodeo. Along the way, he met Kyndra, a fellow rodeoer who would later become his wife. Today, the two are raising their daughters, Everley and Edelle, on the family ranch.

Balancing rodeo and ranching

Balancing the demands of competing at more than 100 rodeos a year with the work at Elshere Herefords is a team effort — one Cole is thankful to share with his wife and family, whose support makes it all possible.

Elshere Herefords runs about 200 head of registered Hereford cows and 700 head of commercial black cows bred to Hereford bulls. The ranch strives to produce Hereford bulls that produce top-notch F1 black baldy heifers and steers.

Cole and Andy operate the ranch as a 50/50 partnership, with Andy keeping a close eye on day-to-day operations while Cole travels for rodeo. Their goal from the beginning was simple: raise bulls for their own program. But as their herd developed, it became clear they needed a bull sale of their own. The ranch holds an annual bull sale in the winter, selling bulls tailored for efficiency and ideal crossbreeding performance. The Elsheres focus on producing rugged, low-maintenance bulls with strong performance and a good hair coat. They also emphasize pigment, calving ease, milk production and docility.

As Cole has traveled the country competing, he's had the opportunities to bring new ideas home to the ranch. "There's always something to pick up and learn from," he said. "Every rancher does stuff different, especially

> in different areas of the country, so being able to keep that all in the back of your mind and utilize it at home is a great advantage."

> One such example Cole shared was hauling cattle to Nebraska to put them on turnips and radishes during one winter, an idea that was borrowed during his time on the road.

Along the way, he's also built a network of fellow ranchers and ag professionals, creating a community of support across the country.

This past season, Cole faced an unexpected challenge: a neck fusion surgery in May that put a pause on competing for six months. While the procedure meant stepping away from rodeo, it also gave him the rare



gift of time at home.

"I've been getting to do a lot more ranching and spend every day at home with the girls," he said.

Once Cole undergoes a follow-up CAT scan, he will have a clearer timeline for getting back in the arena — something he fully intends to do. However, as one of the oldest full-time professional bronc riders still competing, he's discovered how much he values the ranching life. "It's going to be a very easy transition for me from rodeo into ranching full time," he noted.

As he looks ahead to resuming competition, Cole shared his appreciation for the life he's said he's been lucky to live.

"I'm just thankful that the Lord has blessed me to be part of a family operation and spend time with family every day," Cole said. "I'm so thankful that we all enjoy this lifestyle. I feel very blessed to be able to do something I love, whether it is rodeo or ranching." — Anna Miller Fortozo, WLJ managing editor, Reprinted with permission



Obituaries

Mary Strang

Longtime Meeker resident Mary Strang, 87, peacefully passed away on August 25. 2025, at her home surrounded by her family.



Mary was born June 25, 1938, in Princeton, NJ, to the late Rev. John C. Crocker, Sr. and Mary Hallowell Crocker. She was the youngest of six children.

At the age of two, Mary's family moved to Groton, MA, when her father became the headmaster of Groton School. She spent her childhood summers at the family home on the island of North Haven, ME. While there, she, her siblings, and other cousins were given tremendous freedom to use the skiffs off the dock and explore the various features of the Point, including its mudflats. Her gusto for adventure, regardless of how dirty the task, earned her the fond title of "Dirty Gert." How she played as a child is indicative of how she approached life.

Mary attended Concord Academy and graduated high school from Milton Academy. She attended Smith College in Northampton, MA.

At 16, Mary and a friend travelled to Ralston Creek Ranch near Golden, CO. She met and fell in love with Bart Strang that summer. It's a wonder that the decision to go to Ralston Creek one July ended up changing her life forever, at a young age, as she decided to leave life in New England and jump into being a rancher's wife. Mary and Bart were united in marriage on September 13, 1958, in Groton, MA. Four girls, Mary, Ellen, Lisa, and Sarah were born to them.

Mary and Bart spent their first years of marriage on the family ranch at Ralston Creek. In 1960, they moved to Carbondale, CO. They purchased their first Hereford cattle in 1962 while they were ranching in Carbondale with Bart's brother, Mike, and friend Tom Turnbull. In 1968, they moved to their own place on West Sopris Creek in Basalt, CO. In addition to their registered and commercial cattle business, they operated a summer program for teenagers, serving as surrogate parents to 40 teens for eight weeks. Each summer, the Strang family of six grew to 60 as everyone shared life on the ranch in the Colorado high country. Mary prepared three meals a day for her large summer family of 60. It was routine for her to bake 20 loaves of bread, make 10 pies, and prepare large amounts of meat, salad, and vegetables. Alongside managing the summer business and raising four daughters, Mary helped Bart develop their herd of Hereford cattle. She took weekend ski trips to Buttermilk, assisted with 4-H projects, attended bull sales and junior rodeos, and served as a trustee for Rocky Mountain School. The friendships she formed during this time lasted until her death.

The family moved to Meeker, CO, in 1973 and focused solely on raising cattle. Mary quickly became involved in many facets of the community, including the Episcopal Church, school, 4-H, and Community Choir, to name a few. An advocate for youth and education, Mary volunteered her time in classrooms and boardrooms, never passing up the opportunity to help someone.

The cattle operation became the center of Mary's life. She found joy in the simple tasks of dragging fields in the spring and cleaning stalls during calving season. She learned to manage a website, edit videos, and market bulls with the best. Annual bull sales and showing carloads of yearling bulls at the National Western Stock Show were her working vacations.


Throughout her life, Mary devoted

immeasurable effort to supporting the youth of each community she lived in. She was a staunch supporter of education and enrichment for all students, believing that the arts were an integral part of every child's education. She spent many years on the Meeker School Board and was the driving force behind the creation of the Meeker Education Foundation (MEF). The MEF now provides crucial funding for the Meeker School District.

He was born at home where his birth was documented in the family Bible. Stewart attended and graduated from Platte Valley School in Saratoga, WY. He won the State FFA Showman and All-Around Cowboy at Wyoming State Junior Rodeo in 1956, was the first recipient from Saratoga to receive the State Farmer Degree in 1957, and the first ever recipient of the National FFA American Degree in 1958. He also qualified for the National High School Rodeo in 1955, 1956 and 1957.

Runner

On June 4, 1959 in Rawlins, WY, he married his lifetime companion Elizabeth (Betsy) Aguirre who he met at a rodeo and asked her to be in the Cowhide Race with him. That wild ride started their life together. To this union three children were born: Charlotte in 1960, Raymond in 1961 and Trina in 1962. They lived many places during their married life: Saratoga until 1972; Athol from 1972-1998; and Tonopah where they last settled.

Ranch work and Hereford cattle along with horses were his life's work. Then moving to Arizona they opened S&B Horse Motel and RV Park. He loved Arizona because he hated snow, especially after the winter of 1996-1997 where South Dakota had 111 inches of snow. While in South Dakota he and Betsy managed the Lewis Double E Ranch raising Hereford cattle. The ranch received many honors for their cattle over the years. Stewart was especially proud of a bull named SunSet being named Champion Bull at the American Royal in Kansas City in 1994. Stewart was an avid horseman and took great pride in breaking and training the horses he rode. He was especially proud of Sparky, a colt he bought from the Raymond Sutton family. Sparky passed just a short time before Stew. After Betsy's passing in 2013, Ray moved to help and care for Stewart until just two weeks before his passing allowing him to stay in his home as long as possible.

Brent and Robin Meeks of Upstream Ranch often teased the couple as every time they were seen together (which was almost always) they would be holding hands even after the honeymoon period wore off.


In the fall of 2017, Bryan became quite ill. Two hospitals and two weeks later, he had turned the corner and was improving greatly. He came home from that hospital stay with a nervous wife that just hoped and prayed she didn't do something wrong with the medical devices and cause a catastrophe. Bryan recovered well and was living an incredibly great life. He was able to rest and recover at home as he had full faith and trust that his wife was more than capable of running the ranch in two

locations. Bryan always told people the ranch could run without him, but it would never run without his wife. This was a true testament to the love they shared.

Bryan's health took a major turn for the worse in having to undergo open heart surgery in 2022. He truly fought for his life the entire month of August and most of September. He finally made the move to a long term care facility/rehabilitation center in late September, and that is where he started rebuilding his life- completely reteaching every single muscle in his body. 116 days from the day he walked into the hospital for his open heart surgery, he walked out of the rehab facility and into his home. During this time, due to the surgery complications Bryan was placed on dialysis. This became the new normal that he and Linda navigated while at home and traveling. Linda was trained to do his treatments and it just became part of their new normal, while maintaining and keeping the passion of a progressive Hereford cowherd moving forward.

Bryan was proud of many things in his life: high school state football champions, showing the National Reserve Champion Pen of 4 bulls at the National Western Stock, National Champion Horned Female in Fort Worth, the MANY division champions that were shown, and more recently owning and exhibiting the Supreme
